NEW BUSINESS

Resolution No. 2677, a resolution of the City Council of the City of Redlands increasing the LARTS area and changing TASC bylaws, was discussed by the Council relative to area, future effect, and possible cost. It was concluded that this change would be of future benefit to the City of Redlands, and the resolution was unanimously adopted on motion of Councilman DeMirjyn, seconded by Councilman Knudsen.

Resolution No. 2678, a resolution of the City Council of the City of Redlands urging enactment of Senate Bill 425, which advocates the return of solutions to regional problems to local control, was considered in detail and unanimously adopted on motion of Councilman Martinez, seconded by Councilman DeMirjyn.

Signs

At this time Councilmen Capen and Ghormley were excused by Mayor Quick. Melissa Hartzell, speaking for the Building and Safety Department, presented for adoption Ordinance No. 1366, an ordinance of the City of Redlands amending Ordinance No. 1342, which regulates signs in the City of Redlands. This amendment would exempt "For Rent" and "For Sale" signs posted by owners on private property from licensing. Following discussion, the ordinance was given first reading of the title and laid over, with second reading set for the Council meeting of May 7, 1968.

On motion of Councilman Cummings, seconded by Councilman Martinez, a grant deed from the Gladia Corporation for street and alley right-of-way was accepted, with the City Manager authorized to execute the certificate of acceptance on behalf of the City.

Sidney Strickland, speaking for the City Manager, announced the refund to the City of \$20,500 from State Compensation Insurance, due to a lower accident rate among the employees, and congratulated the employees for their safety program.

On motion of Councilman Cummings, seconded by Councilman Martinez, Council authorization was given for transfer of \$2,500 from the General Fund to the Special Aviation Fund to match the State grant which has just been received.

Sidney Strickland presented a grant deed from the University of Redlands to the City for right-of-way for construction of University Street from Brockton Avenue north 517 feet to permit construction of the access road to the stadium parking lot, in accordance with the agreement between the City, the School District and the University. On motion of Councilman Martinez, seconded by Councilman Cummings, Council accepted the grant deed and authorized the City Manager to execute the certificate of acceptance on behalf of the City.

In closing the meeting Mayor Burroughs congratulated the young people on their participation in this program, stressed the need for continuing their education, and wished them success in their future endeavors.

Acting Mayor Dave Quick then adjourned the meeting to the next regular Council meeting, May 7, 1968.
