ORAL PETITIONS

Problem of Loud Music

Mr. F. A. Artrip of 709 West Pioneer Avenue addressed Council concerning a problem of noisy music in his neighborhood and requested adoption of a city ordinance to give the police power to arrest noisemakers. City Attorney Taylor explained to Mr. Artrip the section of the Penal Code which provides for prosecution by the County District Attorney in cases of disturbance of the peace. This area of the code specifically applies to loud noises which are objectionable. Mr. Taylor further explained that the City has no ordinances pertaining to this, and that it would be necessary to bring a civil action, which could be done by Mr. Artrip filing a complaint and identifying those making the disturbance. Following further comments concerning this problem, Councilman DeMirjyn offered to speak with the young people involved if Mr. Artrip would furnish him with their names.

Mr. Artrip also requested that more 25-mile speed signs be placed on Pioneer Avenue, especially at the intersections of Texas and Pioneer and Orange and Pioneer. Vice Mayor Martinez stated that this would be referred to the Traffic Commission.
