The meeting was opened with the pledge of allegiance, followed by the invocation by Reverend Gery Friesen of the Seventh Day Adventist Church who spoke of Dr. Hill and asked the Lord's solace for the family.

Minutes of the adjourned regular meeting of September 8, 1981, were approved as submitted. City Attorney Holmes added the following words to page eight, paragraph 6, of the minutes of September 1, 1981, "Ordinance Publication, immediately after "to reduce costs" ", and the designation of the City Attorney as the official to prepare ordinance summaries when necessary thereunder." 1. R.P.C. No. 552 - Ordinance No. 1000 Text Amendment No. 158 - City of Redlands

> That R.P.C. No. 552, a resolution of the Planning Commission for adoption of Ordinance No. 1000 Text Amendment No. 158 which establishes minimum side and rear yard setbacks for accessory buildings in the R-E Zone, be approved. On motion of Councilman Martinez, seconded by Councilman Riordan, R.P.C. No. 552 was approved by AYE votes of all present, and Ordinance No. 1769, an ordinance of the City of Redlands adopting Ordinance No. 1000 Text Amendment No. 158, was introduced, given first reading of the title, and laid over under the rules with public hearing set for October 6, 1981, at 7:00 P.M.

2. Lot Line Adjustment No. 185 - Ted Thompson

> That Lot Line Adjustment No. 185 for property located at 842 High Avenue, R-2 Zone, be approved subject to the recommendations of all departments as contained in Planning Commission minutes dated September 8, 1981. On motion of Councilman Martinez, seconded by Councilman Riordan, this recommendation of the Planning Commission was approved by AYE votes of all present.

Tentative Tract No. 10461 - Ralph W. Hornbeck - Time Extension 1.

> That a second time extension of one year be granted to Tentative Tract No. 10461. In answer to Council's questions, Mr. Atencio explained past policy has been to grant a second extension of one year but not a third.

4. Conditional Use Permit No. 331 - John Cowie - Time Extension

ADDENDA ITEM

Sunset and Wabash Project Bids City Manager Christiansen brought Council attention to a letter from the County of San Bernardino requesting Council to go on record approving the low bid of Jesse Hubbs & Sons, Colton, for \$368,000 for the Sunset Drive/Wabash Avenue project. As this bid is considerably lower than the engineering estmate of \$546,806, Council approved award of the bid on motion of Councilman Riordan, seconded by Councilman Martinez, by AYE votes of all present.

There being no further business, Council adjourned to a closed session.

Joslyn Senior Center On motion of Councilman Martinez, seconded by Councilman Riordan, Council granted the Joslyn Senior Center permission to conduct a "Trash and Treasure" sale on the premises of the Center on October 22 from 9:00 A.M. to 3:00 P.M.

Plymouth Village Plymouth Village was granted permission to hold their 1981 Fall Festival on Saturday, October 17, 1981, on the grounds on motion of Councilman Martinez, seconded by Councilman Riordan.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Ordinance No. 1771

Sign Advisory Committee Ordinance No. 1771, an ordinance of the City of Redlands amending the Redlands Ordinance Code and Ordinance No. 1770 by establishing a Sign Advisory Committee consisting of the Director of Building and Safety or his designated representative and the Director of Planning and Community Development or his designated representative, was given first reading of the title and laid over under the rules with second reading and public hearing set for October 6, 1981, at 7:00 P.M.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS (Continued)

Funds Airport Fire Truck On motion of Councilman Riordan, seconded by Councilman Martinez, approval was given for transfer of a \$5,000 loan from the Legal and Capital Fund to Special Aviation Fund to purchase a truck for fire protection at Redlands Airport.

NEW BUSINESS

Resolution No. 3771

Modification to State Sewer Standards Resolution No. 3771, a resolution of the City Council of the City of Redlands declaring that the adoption of certain changes and modifications to the State Building Standards Code relating to the standards of availaility of the public sewer is determined necessary for the preservation of public health and welfare, and further that such changes and modifications are justified by local climatic, geographic and topographic conditions, was adopted by AYE votes of all present on motion of Councilman Gorman seconded by Councilman Riordan.

CITY MANAGER

Bid Call Drainage Improvements The City Clerk was authorized to advertise for bids for drainage improvements at Fern Avenue and Arrowview Drive, Judson Street between Lugonia and Colton Avenues, and at Arrow Drive and Clock Avenue on motion of Councilman Riordan, seconded by Councilman Martinez, by AYE votes of all present.

Sewer Easement On motion of Councilman Martinez, seconded by Councilman Gorman, Council accepted by AYE votes of all present a sewer pipeline easement across property located southwesterly of the intersection of Redlands Boulevard and New Jersey Street from Rancho Citrus Amigos, a limited partnership.

Council had received a request from CG Engineering regarding the cancellation of a Land Conservation Contract under the Williamson Act. The Council discussed the matter briefly. Then Attorney Holmes gave a detailed explanation of the ramifications of the Williamson Act to the Council and advised that no motion be made.

Land Conservation Contract

Pat Meyer of CG Engineering explained that his reason for coming to Council was for an information discussion to ascertain the feeling of the Council regarding such properties in the airport area.

Council then noted the location of the property in question, the plans for the airport, and made no official objection.

Water and Sewer Service Denied By AYE votes of all present, Council denied a request for outside the City water and sewer service for Joseph E. Bonadiman and Associates, Inc. for a 7.5 acre parcel which fronts on Redlands Boulevard, west of Alabama Street, as the proposed project is in conflict with the City's General Plan on motion of Councilman Gorman, seconded by Councilman Riordan.

Freeway Oriented Signs Following discussion of Maps A and B which presented departmental recommendations for freeway oriented signing, Council adopted Map A with deletion of the area north of freeway exit at the Eureka Street offramp and north of Colton Avenue at the Sixth Street offramp, on motion of Councilman Riordan, seconded by Councilman Gorman, by AYE votes of all present.

Attorney Holmes explained that this document is the map labled Freeway Oriented Property in Section 84504.20 of the Sign Code, Ordinance No.1770.

CITY MANAGER (Continued)

Rear Loader Packer Body On motion of Councilman Martinez, seconded by Councilman Riordan, Council authorized the purchase of a 25-yard, high compaction, rear loader packer body for the Disposal Department by AYE votes of all present. This item has been budgeted for an estimated \$27,500.

CITY ATTORNEY

C-Y Development Report Attorney Holmes stated the C-Y Development and Harvest Investment Company case that we were successful on in Federal Court has been appealed to the Ninth Circuit, United States Court of Appeals so we will be taking that up to higher court.

Amicus Brief On motion of Councilman Gorman, seconded by Councilman Martinez, Council authorized City Attorney Holmes to write an amicus brief in support of the City of Gridley in their suit IBEW versus City of Gridley. This is a union versus city case with the main point being whether the city has the authority to discharge employees on the basis of engaging in an illegal strike and will be heard before the Supreme Court of the State of California. Attorney Holmes assured the Council that this would be at no cost to the City.

Bills and salaries were ordered paid as approved by the Finance Committee.

There being no further business, Council adjourned, on motion, at 7:45P.M.
