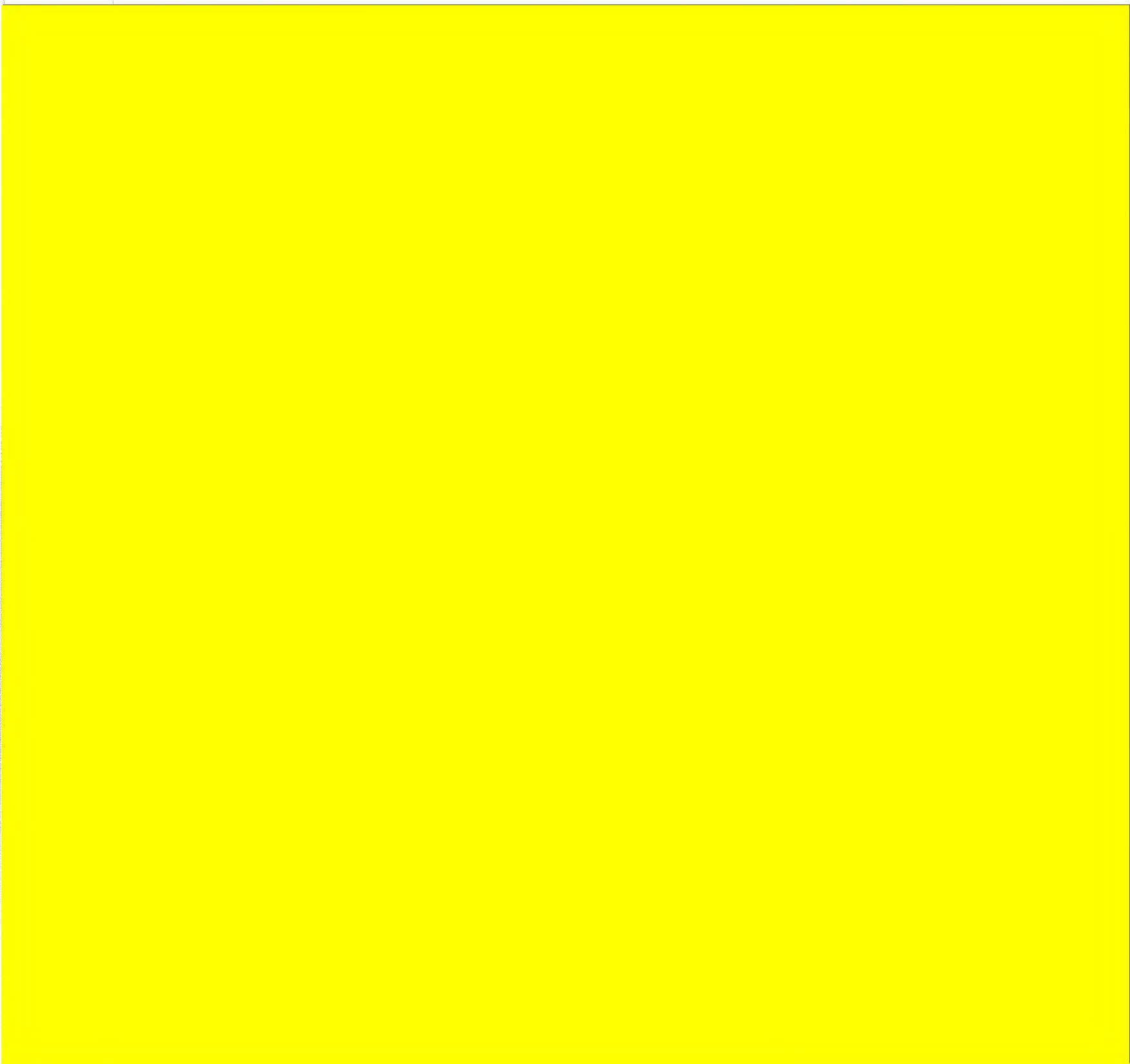




MINUTES

The regular meeting of the City Council held on March 17, 1987, was adjourned to this time and place in order to hold this meeting for the purpose of permitting Redlands High School students to take over the functions of various elected officials and departments of City government in participation of the Annual Civics Day. Prior to the City Council meeting, a special meeting of the Board of Education of the Redlands Unified School District was held. The City Council meeting convened at 1:55 P.M.

California Conservation Corps Alan Newbauer, Supervisor of the City's California Conservation Corps, briefly explained how the City has benefitted from the services of the CCC during this past calendar year. Staff recommended the City apply for another grant to continue the services of the CCC for another year. Council approved the resolution presented at this meeting honoring the California Conservation Corps and expressing its deepest appreciation for all its efforts.

Resolution No. 4236 Following an explanation by Acting Police Chief Brian Corbett, Resolution No. 4236, a resolution of the City Council of the City of Redlands establishing traffic regulations pursuant to Chapter 67 of the Redlands Ordinance Code as recommended by the Traffic Commission, was adopted by AYE votes of all present.

Easement Following an explanation from Lou Perkins, Assistant Utilities Engineer, Council authorized by AYE votes of all present a Grant of Easement to the Southern California Edison Company for a pole anchor at the Horace Hinckley Water Treatment Plant.

Bid Award Acting City Engineer Steven Harris recommended that the contract for the repair of rock curbs be awarded to RACO Environmental Services, Inc. as theirs was the lowest, responsible bid. Following discussion, Council approved this recommendation by AYE votes of all present.

Acting Building and Safety Director Marja Kelly presented statistical information of the department's activities this past year.
