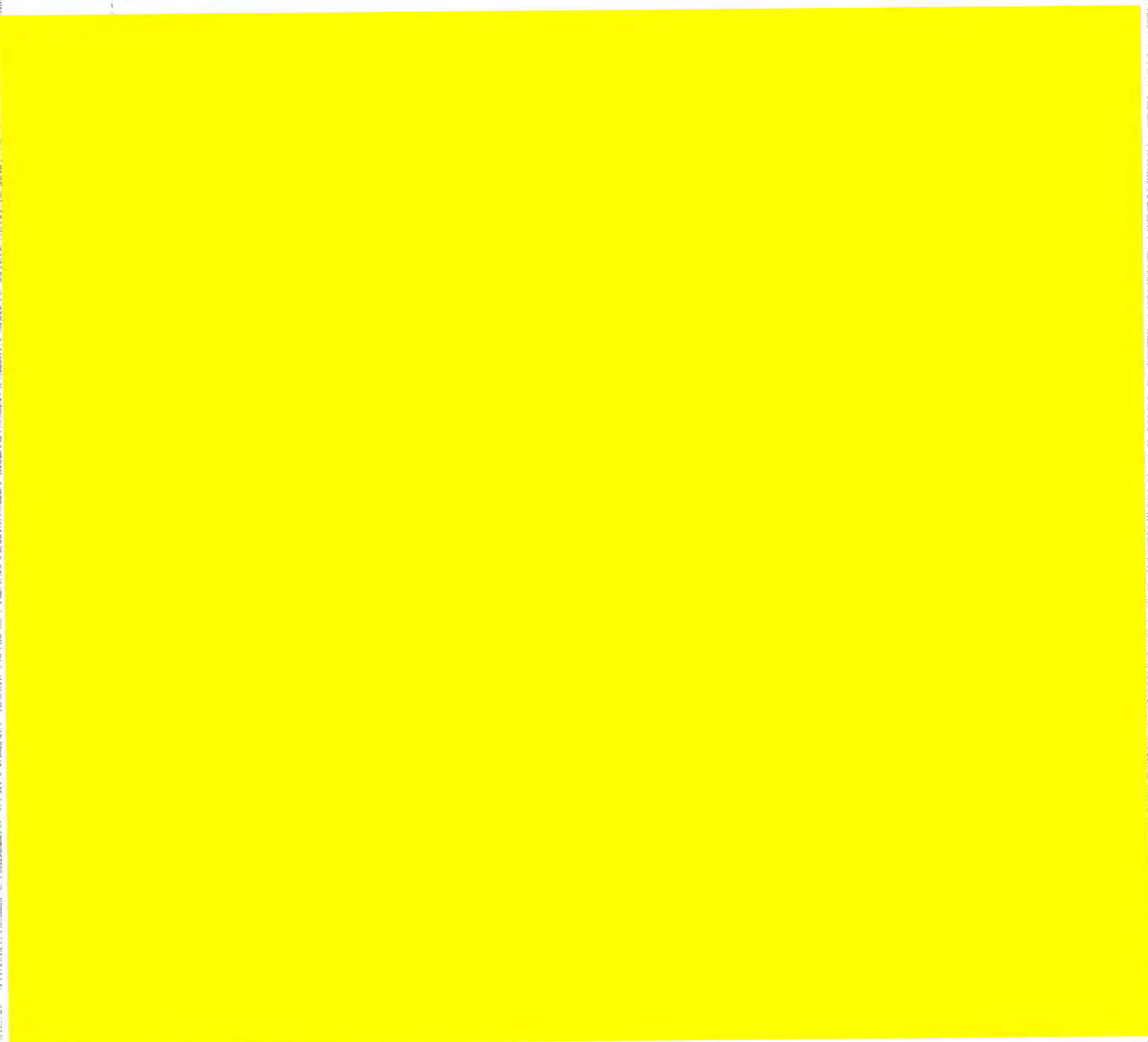




MINUTES

The purpose of the meeting was to meet with members of the City Council of the City of Highland and the San Bernardino County Water Conservation District to discuss reuse of Norton Air Force Base and the environmental study of sand and gravel operations by C. L. Pharris in the Santa Ana Wash. This meeting was attended by several staff members from each City and many concerned citizens. San Bernardino's Mayor Bob Holcomb also was present although he did not speak.

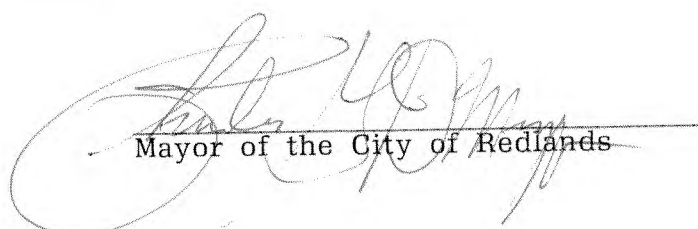
Redlands' City Attorney McHugh introduced the subject of the sand and gravel operation and reviewed past events. Tom Dotson briefly explained the scope of the Environmental Impact Report being prepared which he expects to have in draft form in February or March, 1990.

NAFB

City of Highland's Councilmember Dennis Johnson reviewed meetings held by the Norton Economic Expansion Committee, the latest as recent as last night. He expressed his frustrations with the leadership gap of this committee and stated he was working toward an industrial park with limited air use for the base. Mayor Pro Tem Beswick expressed Redlands' deep concerns with the "rules of the game" which need clear definition before we proceed. It was suggested a meeting be held with the City Managers of the five cities involved to discuss the proposed joint powers agreement which apparently is now available through County Supervisor Hammock's office. It was also suggested that the City Councils from all the cities involved hold a joint meeting in the very near future in order to address the alleged January 12, 1990, deadline.

The meeting adjourned at 8:52 A.M. The next regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Redlands will be held on December 19, 1989.
