Cultural Arts Workshop - Cultural Arts Commissioners Kathleen Gura, Charles Baker, and Bill McCalmon met with the City Council and presented their strategic Plan for 1990-92. City Manager Holmes informed the commissioners that City Council desired to acquire the Fox Theater building during the next fiscal year. Council agreed to review the Art in Public Places ordinance that was tabled some time ago.

Fire Code - Fire Chief Mills reported that Ordinance No. 2105, which is scheduled for public hearing during the evening session, will require fire sprinklers in all new construction of single-family and multi-family residences. A video was presented showing the advantages of fire sprinklers and slides of the Fernwood Condo fire were shown.

Yucaipa - Community Development Director Shaw reviewed the request for a change of the Yucaipa Sphere of Influence for areas which overlap Redlands' existing Sphere of Influence in the Crafton Hills, along the I-10 Outer Highway, and in the Live Oak Canyon. This matter was continued to the afternoon session.

Utility Users Tax - City Attorney McHugh presented another draft of the initiative ordinance for the utility users tax which is scheduled for the June 1990 ballot. Council discussed the tax reduction for large service users, the allocation process and exemptions.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 11:32 A.M.
