ABSENT

This special meeting of the Council was called for the purpose of considering the action of the San Bernardino Redevelopment Agency as reported in the San Bernardino Sun edition of August 24, 1967 and its implications on the City of Redlands, and to take whatever action may be desired by the City Council to protect the interests of the City of Redlands.

Mayor Burroughs briefly reviewed the negotiations of the past two years between San Bernardino and the City of Redlands relative to the establishing of an airport on a portion of the Marigold Farm acreage, from the first suggested Joint Powers Agreement to the last proposed de-annexation of 350 acres from the City of Redlands.

City Manager Merritt displayed a large map of the area under consideration and pointed out that under the presently reported airport plans, it would appear that the Edison power plant would become an island of county property between San Bernardino and Redlands. He reminded the Council of the close association between this plant and the City, including the fact that it is now a part of the Redlands School District and recommended that Council initiate negotiations to annex this property to the City of Redlands.

Following discussion, on motion of Councilman Cummings, seconded by Councilman Martinez, Resolution No. 2619, a resolution of the City Council of the City of Redlands initiating on its own motion proceedings to

annex certain uninhabited territory - Annexation No. 30 - and authorizing the City Manager to file the necessary applications with the Local Agency Formation Commission of the County of San Bernardino, was adopted by the following roll call vote:
