Resolution 3104 No. Cemetery Fees

Cemetery Superintendent Vander Linde gave a brief historical sketch of the Hillside Memorial Park, and stated that it is one of two in the State which is entirely self-supporting, and presented Resolution No. 3104, which amends Resolution No. 2993, establishing cemetery fees. On motion of Councilman DeMirjyn, seconded by Councilwoman Grace, Resolution No. 3104 was unanimously adopted.

Disposal Containers Following a report by Acting Director of Sanitation Philipp Schmidt on the desirability of a lease - sale program to make proper disposal containers available to downtown area businesses, unanimous approval was given to this plan on motion of Councilman Miller, seconded by Councilwoman Grace.

Hamburger Fry On motion of Councilman DeMirjyn, seconded by Councilman Miller, permission was unanimously granted the Redlands Shrine Club to accept donations within Sylvan Park for their hamburger fry on July 13, 1974.
