Water Workshop

Mayor Beswick called the meeting to order and announced that the purpose of this special meeting was to broaden Council's information base on water. Information was presented regarding the history of Big Bear Lake, the City's mutual water companies stock purchases policies, and current supply and sources; Redlands water sources; water quality/groundwater/state water project/toxics; Santa Ana River Basin Management; pricing and conservation; state politics; and the Hinckley Water Treatment Plant. Council reviewed City policies and gave guidelines to the Public Works Department for possible changes.

Water Treatment Plant

Speaking from the audience regarding whether or not the new water treatment plant was necessary was: Jerry Dibble and Louis Fletcher. In light of information received at this meeting, Councilman Johnson moved to suspend further action on the Hinckley Plant until September 3, 1985. Motion seconded by Councilman Martinez and carried by AYE votes of all present.
