

Ord No 103

An Ordinance regulating the removal and burial of dead animals.

The Board of Trustees of the City of Redlands do enact as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for the owner, or person having the possession or control of any animal dying within the City of Redlands to neglect or neglect such animal to remain unburied for more than twenty-four hours after the death of such animal; and every such animal shall be deemed unburied within the meaning of this ordinance unless placed ~~at least~~ ~~a depth~~ below the surface of the ground and under a covering of earth of at least three feet in thickness; provided that any dead animal shall be buried ~~within~~ in any street, avenue, alley, ~~or other place~~ or ~~place~~ within said city.

Section 2. When any dead animal shall be found upon any street, Avenue, ~~or~~ alley or other public place, and the

of its death cannot be ascertained, it shall be the duty of the marshal of the city to cause such animal to be forthwith buried in the manner ~~provided~~ ^{required} by Section 1 hereof of this ordinance, provided that the place of burial shall be at least ^{one} hundred feet from any dwelling-house [or travelled highway].

3. Any violation of Section 1 of this ordinance shall be a misdemeanor or, and shall be punishable by a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more than fifty dollars, or by imprisonment for the city Prison for not less than one day, nor more than three days.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect from and after the date of its passage.
