AN ORDINANCE APPROVING THE ANNEXATION OF CERTAIN UNINH SITED TERRITORY, DESIGNATED "ANNEXATION NO. 7" TO THE CITY OF REDLANDS, CALIFORNIA.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDLANDS:

WHEREAS, on the 25th day of November, 1959, the Council of the City of Redlands did pass and adopt Resolution No. 1085 giving notice of the proposal to annex certain uninhabited territory to the City of Redlands, said territory being therein designated as "Annexation No. 7", said Resolution describing the boundaries of the territory proposed to be annexed; and

WHEREAS, said Resolution No. 1085 did contain a notice of the day, hour and place when and where the Council of the City would hear protests made by any person owning real property within the territory proposed to be annexed, the time of said hearing being not less than fifteen nor more than fifty days from the date of passage of said Resolution; and

WHEREAS, on the 21st day of December, 1959, at the hour of 7 p.m., in the Council Chambers in the City Hall of the City of Redlands, County of San Bernardine, State of California, said time and place being the day, hour and place fixed in said Resolution No. 1085 for hearing protests to the said sunexation, and as continued to January 5, 1960, and on January 19, 1960, at the same time and place, the said City Council did hear and pass upon all protests made to the proposed annexation and did determine that protests had not been made by the owners of one-half of the value of the territory proposed to be annexed as shown by the last equalized assessment roll, nor by public and private owners of one-half of the yalue of the territory proposed to be annexed as determined by said legislative body; and

WREREAS, said territory is contiguous to the City of Redlands, and is universabited territory in the County of San Bernardino;

NOW, THEREFORE, the said Council of the City of Redlands does hereby approve the annexation of the territory bereinafter described to the City of Redlands, and does hereby further ordain that the said territory be and is nereby annexed to the City of Redlands.

That said territory, the annexation of which to the City of Redlam's is herein approved, is all that territory situated in the County of San Bernardino, State of California, more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of the West boundary of the City of Redlands with the East and Vest quarter section line of Section 21, T. IS., R. 3W., S.B.B.&M:

Thence Westerly along said quarter section line, being also along the center line of Lugonia Avenue, to an intersection with the West line of the East half of the Southwest quarter of said Section 21;

Thence Southerly along said West line to an intersection with the center line of Colton Avenue as said avenue is shown on Map of the Barton Ranch, recorded in Book 6, Page 19 of Maps, in the office of the Recorder of San Bernardino County;

Thence along the center line of said Colton Avenue to an intersection with the center line of Kansas Street as said street is shown on said Map of the Barton Ranch;

Thence Southerly along said center line to an intersection with the Northeasterly right of way line of the Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company, 100 feet wide;

Thence Southeasterly along said right of way line to an intersection with the West boundary of the City of Hedlands;

Thence Northerly slong said boundary to the point of beginning.
