Facts April 6 1923
ORDINANCE NO. 652

An Ordinance of the City of Redlands approving the Annexation of Terracina District to said city.

Whereas, heretofore, there was presented to the Board of trustees of the City of Redlands, a Municipal Corporation of the Sixth Class, in San Bernardino County, State of California, a written petition signed as provided by law, for the annexation of certain territory described in such petition to said city; and

Whereas, said petition asked that said territory described therein be annexed to said city; and

Whereas, thereupon said board of trustees of said city called a special election as provided by law, and submitted to the electors residing in the said territory proposed by such petition to be annexed to such city, the question whether such territory shall be annexed to, incorporated in and made a part of such city;

Whereas, such Board of Trustees caused notice of such election to be given in all respects as provided by law and in which said notice the date of such election was distinctly stated and also the proposition to be submitted thereat, to-wit: That it was proposed to annex to, incorporate in and make a part of such city the territory sought to be annexed and specifically describing the boundaries thereof, and designating in such notice such territory by an appropriate name for identification, and thereupon caused ballots to be printed and used at such election in all respects as required by law; and

Whereas, the proceedings for such election were held and conducted in form and manner and in all respects as provided by law therefor; and

Whereas, thereafter, upon a return of such election and a canvass of the vote thereat it appears that there were 38 votes cast at such election, of which 30 were for the annexation of such territory to said city and 8 votes were cast against such annexation, and which such canvass was made by said Board of Trustees, of said city at the time

provided for its regular meeting next after the expiration of three days from and after the date of such election; and

Whereas, thereupon, said Board of Trustees caused a record of such canvass to be made and entered upon its minutes in all respects as provided by law; and

Whereas, it appears from the canvass of the said returns of said election that a majority of all the votes cast in such territory to be so annexed were in favor of such annexation; and

Whereas, the said Board of Trustees of said city are in favor of such annexation,

Now Therefore, The Board of Trustees of the City of Redlands, do Ordain as follows:

Section 1.—That the annexation to the City of Redlands of the territory hereinafter described by the electors in such territory by their vote at an election held therein on March 15th, 1923, be and the same is hereby approved and such territory is hereby annexed to such city.

The territory so annexed to said city is situated in San Bernardino County, State of California, bounded and described as follows, to-wit:

Commencing at a point on the west line of the City of Redlands, three hundred ninety-five (395) feet northerly of the north line of Olive Avenue and perpendicular thereto; thence along a line parallel to said North line of Olive Avenue and three hundred and ninety-five (395) feet therefrom westerly to a point on the west line of Section thirty-three (33), Township One (1) South, Range Three (3) West, S. B. B. M.; thence along the west line of said Section 33, and Section 4, Township 2 South, Range 3 West, S. B. B. M., to a point five hundred (500) feet southerly from the south line of the Southern Pacific Company's railroad right of way and perpendicular thereto; thence along the line parallel with the south line of said Southern Pacific Company's railroad right of way and five hundred (500) feet therefrom easterly to the west city line; thence northerly along the west city line to point of beginning.

Section 2. — This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage as provided by law.

ORDINANCE NO.

An Ordinance of the City of Redlands, fixing the Rate and Levies for Property Tax for the Fiscal Year 1923-24.

The Board of Trustees of the City of Redlands do ordain as follows:
Section 1. There is hereby upon all taxable property in the City of Redlands, California, for the Fiscal Year 1923-24, a proper one dollar and sixty (\$1.60) each one hundred (\$100.00) of the assessed valuation of such property, apportioned as follows:

- One Hundred Cents for the General Fund;
- Seventeen Cents for the Fire Department;
- Six Cents for Redemption of Interest Municipal Improvement;
- Five Cents for Redemption of Interest of Park Bonds;
- Four Cents for Redemption of Interest of Special Municipal Bonds;
- Eight Cents for Redemption of Interest Redlands City Park;
- Twenty Cents for Redemption of Interest Municipal Water.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force after its passage.

ORDINANCE NO.

An Ordinance of the City of Redlands, amending section Chapter VIII of Ordinance of said City relating to streets, in drains, ditches and Sewers.

The Board of Trustees of the City of Redlands, do ordain as follows:
Sec. 1. Sec. 66 of Chapter VIII of Ordinance No. 639 of said City is hereby amended to read as follows:
Sec. 66. Rubbish on Streets, Ditches and Sewers. No person shall place upon any sidewalk, or in any drain, water ditch, any trash, garbage, waste matter, glass, filthy or decayed matter, liquids, dead animals, or anything likely to be or become a nuisance or to injure or damage property or person of another place or deposit in any drain thereto any trash, waste matter, garbage, oils or any solid substance of any kind, or to permit to be placed into the drain pipe or into any sewer any oil, grease, or motor vehicles or other things therefrom.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force after its passage as provided by law.
