

An Ordinance to regulate the business of keeping billiard halls and pool rooms, and to regulate, levy and collect license on such business.

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The board of trustees of the city of Redlands do ordain as follows:-

Section 1:- It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in, conduct, carry on, manage or control, within the city of Redlands, the business of keeping a billiard hall or pool room where billiards or pool or similar games are played, without first obtaining a license so to do.

Section 2:- Such license may be obtained by filing with the city clerk of said city a written application signed by the applicant desiring such license setting forth the place where said business is to be conducted; that the applicant will not, nor will any one in his employ, permit or allow any gambling at his said place of business; that he will not, nor will any one in his employ, permit or allow any spirituous, vinous, malt or mixed liquors or alcoholic or intoxicating drinks to be kept, sold, furnished, delivered, given away or drunk upon or at said place of business; and that he will not conduct said business in a room or place in which there shall be no stalls, side rooms, or compartments partitioned or built off from the room or place where said business is to be conducted connected with such room or place by a door or other opening.

Section 3. Upon such application being signed as aforesaid and presented to said city clerk, and upon the payment to him for said city of a license fee in the sum of \$3.00.

therefor, and the further sum of fifty cents for each additional billiard or pool table or similar table therein, he shall issue a license to said applicant for the term of three months, provided that such license shall not be issued if at the time of the filing of such application or aforesaid the room or place where said business is to be conducted shall have any stalls, side rooms, or compartments partitioned or built off the same, connected with such room or place by a door or other opening, provided that a partition built across the front part of such room or place so as to separate such part from the part where said billiard or pool tables are kept shall not **prevent** the issuance of such license.

SECTION 4:-Any person violating any of the provisions of section 1 of this ordinance, or who, having obtained such license shall permit or allow gambling at his place of business, or shall permit or allow any spirituous, vinous, malt or mixed liquors, or alcoholic or intoxicating drinks to be kept, sold, furnished, delivered, given away or drunk at such place of business, or shall conduct or carry on such business in a room or place in which there shall be any stalls, side rooms, or compartments partitioned or built off from said room or place and connected with such room or place by a door or other opening, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punishable by a fine not exceeding \$300., or by imprisonment in the City Jail not exceeding three months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

SECTION 5:- Subdivision 3 of section 1 of ordinance No. 313 is hereby repealed.

SECTION 6:- This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after ^{August 12, 1903} ~~the 1st day of January~~; and the city clerk is hereby authorized to publish said ordinance once in the Citrograph, a newspaper published in said city.
