The Ordinance and ~~under~~ ^{Section 7 of} Ordinance No. 37, entitled "An Ordinance Establishing a Board of Health, defining its powers and duties and prescribing certain sanitary regulations," passed May 28th 1889.

The Board of Trustees of the City
of Redlands are certain as follows:

Section 1, Section 7 of Ordinance no. 37,
passed May 28th 1889, the title of
which is recited in the title of
this Ordinance, is hereby amended.
So that said section shall
read as follows, to wit:
Section 7. No person shall in-
ter, cremate or otherwise dispose
of any human body in said city
without having first obtained
a permit therefor from the Sec-
retary of the Board of Health of
said city. ~~Such permit shall be~~

~~granted, only on the production~~
The person applying for such
permit must produce and file
with said Secretary a certificate
signed by a physician, or a common
or two reputable citizens, setting

birth, as near as possible the
name, age, color, place of birth,
occupation, date, locality, and cause
of death of deceased, and no per-
mit shall be granted without the
production of such certificate.
Such permit must be filed with
the County Recorder of the County
of San Bernardino, State of Califor-
nia.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall
take effect from and after the
date of its passage.
