

Ordinance No. 316

An Ordinance regulating the use of streets and sidewalks for the storage of building materials.

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~~XXXX~~ The Board of Trustees of the City of Redlands do ordain as follows:-

Section 1:- It shall be unlawful for any person to use any part of the streets, avenues, alleys, or other public grounds in the City of Redlands for the storage or placing *thereon* of building materials, provided that whenever a building is in course of erection and construction the superintendent of streets of said city may issue a permit to ~~XXX~~ the owner of such building or the contractor thereof permitting the use of the streets, avenue, alleys or public grounds and sidewalks ~~immediately~~ immediately opposite the property upon which said building is being erected, but in no case shall more than one-third of any such streets, avenues, alleys or public grounds ^{or sidewalks} be so obstructed; and in streets containing street car tracks, such occupation shall not come within four feet of such track; provided that whenever any building is being erected immediately adjoining any sidewalk, the superintendent of streets may require the person to whom such permit is issued, to close such sidewalk immediately in front of such building ^{so as to prevent passage and travel thereupon} or to construct a platform over ^{such sidewalk} ~~the same~~, which shall not be less than eight feet in height ~~at~~ above such sidewalk.

Section 2:- Any permit issued under the provisions of

Section 3:- Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall upon conviction be punishable by fine not exceeding \$25.00.

Section 4:- This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
