

ORDINANCE NO. 362.

An Ordinance repealing Ordinance No. 313 and No. 323, and providing for licensing certain kinds of business and fixing the license fee therefor.

The Board of Trustees of the City of Redlands do ordain as follows:

Sec. 1. In the exercise of the Police powers of the City of Redlands and for the purpose of revenue and regulation, all and every kind of business hereinafter mentioned, transacted and carried on within the corporate limits of said city of Redlands, including shows, exhibitions, and lawful games carried on therein, are hereby licensed and the license fee or charge imposed at the following rates per quarter, unless otherwise fixed herein, to wit:

1. For every person at a fixed place of business engaged in the business of selling, Books and Stationery; Sewing Machines; Organs; Pianos; or Musical Instruments; maintaining a Wood Yard or Feed Store; Conducting or having charge of a Planing Mill; Bakery; Printing and Publishing a Newspaper; Drawing and Furnishing Plans for Building; Contracting for the Erection of Buildings; or for Brick, Stone, Cement or Concrete Work; Bill Posting or Advertising Sign Painting; Lending Money; Plumbing; maintaining a Hospital; Selling Goods, Wares, or Merchandise of any kind, except as otherwise Fixed; \$3.50

2. For every person at a fixed place of business engaged in any of the following lines of business, to wit: Notions; Selling, Renting or Repairing Bicycles, Automobiles; Real Estate or Insurance Agency; Merchant Tailoring; Fruit Brokers; Conducting or having charge of a Fruit Stand; Selling Fish or Poultry; Electrical Supplies; The Practice of Dentistry, Medicine, Surgery, or Law; Veterinary Surgery; Civil Engineering; Selling Fruits and Vegetables from wagons; Selling Tombstones or Monumental Goods by sample, photograph or otherwise; Running a Milk Wagon; \$3.00

3. For every person at a fixed place of business engaged in any of the following lines of business, to wit: Clothing, Dry Goods; Lumber; Undertaking Establishments; or Livery Stable, including

- the running of hacks or carriages for the carriage of passengers for hire; \$4.00
4. For every person conducting or managing a Drug Store having a Soda Fountain, \$7.00; without a Fountain, \$4.50; or a Confectionery Store with a Fountain, \$3.00; without a Fountain, \$2.00.
 5. For every person engaged in the business of Selling Ice, from one wagon, \$4.00; from two or more wagons, \$6.00
 6. For every person engaged in the business of Selling Water for domestic use at fixed rates, or furnishing Electricity for lights, heat or power purposes, \$7.00; or furnishing gas for light or power purposes, \$5.00
 7. For every person or corporation conducting a Banking business, \$10.00
 8. For every person managing or having charge of a Fruit Packing or Drying Establishment or Warehouse, \$4.00
 9. Managing or having charge of a Hotel, including the running of a hack for the carriage of passengers therefor, \$5.00; or of a Restaurant or Lunch Counter, \$1.00; of a Lodging House of ten rooms and not exceeding nineteen rooms, \$2.00; with twenty rooms or more, \$2.50
 10. Managing or having charge of a Laundry, including the soliciting and collecting of Laundry therefor, \$5.00;
 11. Every person engaged in the business of soliciting or collecting Laundry, except as otherwise provided, \$15.00
 12. Every person engaged in the business of Wiring Buildings for electric lights or for heat or power purposes, \$3.00
 13. Every person running a Hack, Carriage, or other Vehicle, used for the carriage of passengers for hire, except as otherwise provided; \$5.00
 14. For every Bowling Alley, \$4.00 for first alley, and \$1.00 for each additional alley.
 15. For every Astrologer, Fortune Teller, Clairvoyant, Spiritualist, or Spirit Medium, who demands or receives a fee for their services, \$25.00

16. Running an Express Wagon, Transfer, or Truck for hire, with one horse, \$2.00; with two horses, \$3.00
17. For every person engaged in the business of furnishing Lunches or Meals from any Wagon, Cart, or Counter upon the streets or any public place, \$3.00; provided, that no such Wagon, Cart, or Counter, shall be permitted to occupy any portion of Orange Street, between the Southern Pacific Railway Company's track and Cajon Street.
18. For every person engaged in the business of dealing in Stocks, Margins, Options, or Futures, in any Stock Board, Stock Exchange or Stock Market, \$3.00
19. For every person keeping or conducting or having charge of a Shooting Gallery with female attendant, \$25.00; without such attendant, \$4.00; for the first target and \$1.00 for each additional target.
20. For every exhibition, such as Lung Testers, Muscle Testers, Ball, Knife or Ring Throwing, or all similar in character, not otherwise fixed, \$25.00
21. For every Circus or Menagerie or exhibition of Trained Animals connected by or showing with other attractions, \$40. per day; every exhibition of Trained Animals without such other attractions, \$20.00 per day; every Side Show Exhibition where admission is charged, other than in public or private Halls, \$10.00 per day.
22. For every musical, rope, wire, dancing, magic, contortionist or legerdemain exhibition of performance, or other street exhibition or performance where a collection is taken, or goods, or merchandise, or medicines, of any kind offered for sale, and not otherwise provided for, \$5.00 per day; provided that this subdivision shall not include the performance of a theatrical or operatic company.
23. For every Merry-go-round, \$2.00 per day.
24. For selling bananas upon the street by public outcry or otherwise, \$10.00 per day.

25. Every Artist; Agent; or Canvasser, Selling or Soliciting orders for the sale of Books; Paintings; Taking, Making, Enlarging, or Furnishing Pictures or Photographs of any description, or selling or furnishing Coupons, or Contracts therefor, \$100.00
26. Selling at auction, goods, wares or merchandise of any kind, \$100.00; provided this provision shall not apply to auctioning any goods, wares, or merchandise by a licensed merchant having an established, permanent and fixed place of business, or auctioning household goods, or farming implements at the residence of the owner thereof.
27. For every person operating a street car, used on any street railroad, for each car used, \$2.50
28. Making or Furnishing Abstract of Titles, \$3.00
29. Keeping a Photograph Gallery or place for Painting or Taking Pictures by any process, \$2.50
30. Barber Shops with two chairs or less, \$2.00; for each additional chair, 25¢.
31. Printing or publishing, where no newspaper is published, \$1.
32. Blacksmithing, with one forge, \$2.00; 25¢ for each additional forge.
33. Telegraph Companies or Agencies, Telephone Companies or Agencies, having a franchise from the City of Redlands; Express Companies or Agencies; Steam Railway Companies or Agencies; each for business done within the City of Redlands and not including any business done to or from points without the state and not including business done for the Government of the United States, its Officers or Agents; \$5.00
34. Telephone Companies or Agencies, except as otherwise provided, each for business done within the City of Redlands, and not including any business done to or from points without the state and not including any business done for the government of the United States, its Officers or Agents; \$10.00
35. Every person who shall open, establish, manage, or have charge of a temporary place of business of any kind for the sale of Goods, Wares or Merchandise; or every itinerant or transient merchant, selling or offering for sale any goods, wares, or Merchandise; or every Peddler, Hawker, or other person, other than a licensed merchant doing business in said city,

selling or offering for sale or soliciting orders for the sale of any goods, wares, or Merchandise, by sample or otherwise, to persons not regularly engaged in for carrying on such lines of business, \$100.00; provided, this subdivision shall not apply to the selling or soliciting of orders for the sale of Fruits, Vegetables, or Farm Products.

36. Every person engaged in the business of selling, or offering for sale a bankrupt stock of goods, wares, or merchandise, of any kind not having a license under other provisions of this Ordinance to sell such goods, wares, or merchandise at a fixed place of business; \$100.00

37. Any itinerant vender of any Medicine, Drug, Nostrum, Ointment or appliance of any kind intended for the treatment of diseases or injury, who shall, by writing or printing or by any other method or device, publicly profess to cure or treat diseases or injury or deformity by any Drug, Nostrum or Manipulation or other expedient, \$100.00

38. Every person selling or offering for sale or giving away any Merchandise of any kind, using music or any other device to attract crowds, other than a licensed merchant at a fixed place of business, \$10.00 per day, except as otherwise provided.

39. All other lines of business not otherwise herein provided for, \$2.00

40. Every person engaged in any two or more lines of business specified herein, shall be required to pay the highest charge or fee for the business so engaged in, and every person having four or more lines of business herein fixed where the highest rate charged for any line of business so engaged in does not exceed \$5.00 per quarter; \$5.00

41. For every person managing or having charge of a theatre or opera house, \$5.00

42. Every person engaged in the business of auctioning, \$2.00 per day.

Sec. 2. None of the foregoing subdivisions in Section 1 hereof, fixing a license fee or charge, shall apply to Interstate Commerce.

Sec. 3. Whenever a license shall issue to any person as provided in this Ordinance and it shall afterwards be found that such person has been placed in the wrong classification by the officer issuing such license, such person shall not thereby be relieved of taking out a new license under the right classification for the business so engaged in by him, and paying the license fee as herein fixed, (less the amount already so paid), upon notice so to do by the City Marshal, nor shall ~~he~~ be relieved of the penalties provided by this Ordinance for doing business without a proper license therefor as provided for herein.

Sec. 4. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to conduct, carry on, or do or perform within the corporate limits of said city any business, act, or thing, in this ordinance specified, either in his or their own name or names, or as agent or agents for any other person, or at all, without first procuring from said city a license so to do, and any person who shall within said city conduct, carry on or transact, either in person or as agent as aforesaid, or at all, any business, act, or thing, in this ordinance specified for which a license is required, without having paid for and secured such license, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine not exceeding \$100. or by imprisonment not exceeding ten days, or by both such fine and imprisonment. If such license shall not be paid it shall be deemed a debt to the City of Redlands from the person or persons whose duty it is or shall be to pay the same, and an action against such person or persons may be brought and maintained in the name of said city as plaintiff in any court of competent jurisdiction to recover the same, with costs; provided, that any honorably discharged soldier, sailor or marine of the United States, who is able to obtain a livelihood by manual labor, shall have the right to hawk, peddle and vend any goods, wares or merchandise, except spirituous, malt, vinous

or other intoxicating liquors, without paying any license tax or fee therefor, and upon application therefor, by any such soldier, sailor or marine, a license shall be issued to him, without cost, and provided further that no license shall be required of, or any penalty enforced against, any commercial traveler whose business is limited to the goods, wares, and merchandise sold or dealt in in this state at wholesale.

Sec. 5. The Marshal shall report to the City Clerk every person, firm, association or corporation subject to a license as hereinbefore provided, and the said Clerk shall thereupon prepare the necessary license therefor, and deliver them, with their amount to the Marshal, who shall immediately proceed to collect the same.

Sec. 6. The Marshal shall, on the first Monday of each month, settle with the said Clerk for all moneys received by him under this Ordinance, and immediately pay the same into the treasury of said city on the order of the Clerk, filing with the Treasurer the affidavit required by law in such cases, and taking his receipts for such moneys, filing one of such receipts with the Clerk.

Sec. 7. All licenses under this Ordinance shall become due and payable quarterly in advance, except where a daily or monthly rate is herein fixed, and as to such, they shall be payable in advance for the period of time for which the license may be taken out, either daily or monthly as the case may be.

Sec. 8. Ordinance No. 323, and Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5, of Ordinance No. 313, are hereby repealed; provided, however, that the repeal of such Ordinances shall in no manner release any person from the payment of a license fee therein provided for which shall have become due and payable prior to the date of the repeal thereof.

Sec. 9. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the date of its passage, and posting thereof as provided by law.
