

ORDINANCE NO. 323.

An Ordinance fixing a license tax upon certain kinds of business in the City of Redlands.

The Board of Trustees of the City of Redlands do ordain as follows:

Section 1. For the purpose of revenue and regulation, a license tax is hereby imposed upon the following kinds of business in the City of Redlands, at the following rates: *for groceries, liquor!*

1. Selling hardware; at the rate of \$3.00 per quarter.
2. Selling boots and shoes; \$2.50 per quarter.
3. A furniture store; \$3.00 per quarter.
4. Retail grocery store; \$3.00 per quarter.
5. Selling lumber; \$4.00 per quarter.
6. Jewelry store; ^{3.00} ~~\$3.00~~ per quarter.
7. Book and stationery store; \$2.00 per quarter.
8. Wood yard; \$2.00 per quarter.
9. Feed store; \$2.00 per quarter.
10. Clothing store; \$4.00 per quarter.
11. Dry goods store; \$4.00 per quarter.
12. Drug store, with soda fountain; \$7.00 per quarter.
13. Drug store, without soda fountain; \$4.50 per quarter.
14. Confectionery store; ^{with fountain} ~~\$3.00~~ per quarter, *without fountain \$2.00 per quarter.*
15. A wall paper and paint store; \$3.00 per quarter.
16. Meat market; \$2.50 per quarter.
17. Fish or poultry market; \$2.00 per quarter.

58. Selling musical instruments; \$2.00 per quarter.

59. Peddling from house to house, merchandise or medicine of any kind, including books or pictures; \$5.00 per day.

60. Soliciting or canvassing for retail orders for any article of merchandise for sale; \$5.00 per day.

61. Keeping or conducting a shooting gallery; \$5.00 per day.

62. A fruit stand; \$2.00 per quarter. ^{1.50} ~~2.50~~ _{2.50} ^{with soda fountain}

63. Soliciting for a laundry out of ^{city} ~~city~~; \$10.00 per quarter.

64. Oil and gasoline wagon, or either; \$1.00 per quarter.

65. Selling wagons, carriages or agricultural implements; \$3.00 per quarter.

66. Selling fertilizer; \$3.00 per quarter.

67. Merchant tailors; \$2.00 per quarter.

68. Fruit brokers; \$2.00 per quarter.

69. Contractors in brick and stone masonry; \$2.00 per quarter.

70. Carpenter shop; \$1.25 per quarter.

69. Bill posting: \$2.00 per quarter.

70. Selling electric supplies: \$2.00 per quarter.

71. Telegraph companies or agencies, each for business done

~~exclusively~~ within the City of Redlands, and not including any

business done to or from points without the State and not including any business done for the Government of the United States, its

offices or agents: \$5.00 per quarter.

72. Telephone companies or agencies, each for business done

~~exclusively~~ within the City of Redlands, and not including any

business done to or from points without the State and not including any business done for the Government of the United States, its

offices or agents: \$20.00 per quarter.

73. Express companies or agencies, each for business done

~~exclusively~~ within the City of Redlands, and not including any

business done to or from points without the State and not including any business done for the Government of the United States, its

offices or agents: \$5.00 per quarter.

74. Steam railway companies, each for business done ~~exclusively~~

within the City of Redlands, and not including any business done to

or from points without the State and not including any business done

for the Government of the United States, its offices or agents:

\$5.00 per quarter.

75. Any person doing electric wiring of buildings: \$3.00 per

76. Running an open wagon or truck for hire with one
horse #1.00 per quarter; and with two horses #2.00 per quarter.

77. Any person engaged in any four or more of the
~~different lines of business above specified~~ #3.00 per quarter.

Provided, That by the term "quarter" as used in this ~~Article~~ ^{Ordinance} is meant a period of three months; and that by the term "selling" as used in this Article, is meant selling, attempting to sell, or keeping for sale; and that the term "business" as used in this ~~Article~~ ^{Ordinance} includes the holding of one's self out in any manner to engage in the pursuit or vocation on which a license tax is imposed.

Section 2. A license tax at the rate of license fixed in the foregoing Section for each kind of business therein specified, shall be and is hereby imposed on such business; and no person, firm, association or corporation shall conduct or carry on such business without having paid in advance the amount of such license tax to the Marshal of said City, ^{or mayor} ~~nor shall any person knowingly act as agent for any telegraph, telephone, Express, or Steam railroad company except for such business, before it has paid the above tax to the~~ Section. 3. The Marshal shall report to the Clerk of the City every person, firm, association or corporation subject to a license tax under the terms of this ~~Article~~ ^{Ordinance}, and the Clerk shall prepare the necessary licenses therefor and deliver them, with their amount, and the Marshal shall immediately proceed to collect the same.

Section 4. The Marshal, shall, on the first Monday of each month settle with the Clerk of the City, for all moneys received under this ~~Chapter~~ ^{Ordinance}, and immediately pay the same unto the treasury of the City on the order of the Clerk, filing with the Treasurer the affidavit required by law in such cases, and taking his receipts for such moneys, filing one with said Clerk.

Section 5. Any and every violation of this ~~Ordinance~~ ^{is} hereby declared to be a misdemeanor, and shall be punishable by a fine ~~not less than ten dollars, nor more than one hundred dollars,~~ ^{not exceeding} or by imprisonment in the City prison ~~for~~ not ~~less than one day nor~~
