ORDINANCE NO. 370.

An ordinance of the city of Redlands calling a special election to be held on June 20, 1905, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of said city the proposition to incur a banded indebtedness in the sum of \$100.000. to pay one-for of the cost of certain street work therein.

whereas, the legislative branch of said city of Redlands, at an adjourned regular meeting thereof held on May 16th, 1905, by a resolution duly adopted by a vote of more than two-thirds of all its members, and approved by the executive of said city, determined and declared that the public interest and necessity of said city and of the inhabitants thereof demands the acquisition and construction by said city of certain municipal improvements, consisting of street work, to wit:

The macadamizing, paving with asphalt, the placing of oulverts and drain pipes where necessary on the streets, avenues,
and portions thereof mentioned and described in said resolution and hereinafter described in section one hereof, and as therein
specified.
Now, therefore, the Board of Trustees of the City of Redlends do ordain as follows:

Section 2. The objects and purposes forwhich the said bonded indebtedness of \$100,000. is proposed to be incurred is the acquisition and construction of the macadamizing, paving with asphalt, oiling, the placing of culverts and drain pipes where necessary on the streets, avenues and portions thereof, mentioned and described in section one hereof, and as therein specified; and furnishing to said city and the inhabitants thereof better and more permanent streets and readways therein for public use and travel.

Section 3. The estimated cost of the acquisition and construction of the said proposed municipal improvement and street work above specified in Section one hereof is \$200,000. and the estimated cost of such proposed public improvements and street work to be paid by said city, to-wit, one half of the total cost thereof is \$100,000.

Section 4. If the said proposition to incur said indebtedness for the objects and purposes above mentioned shall be accepted by the qualified voters of said city as in this ordinance and by law provided, then and in that case bonds of said city to the amount of \$100,000. gold coin as aforesaid, for the payment of one-half of the cost of & acquiring and constructing said macadamizing, paving, with asphalt, placing of culverts and drain pipes as aforesaid, shall issue as follows, to-wit: said bonds shall be of the character known as serial, and shall be of such denomination, bear the rate of interest and be paid as hereinafter provided. Bords authorized to be issued pursuant to said election shall bear interest from their issuance until paid at the rate of 4/2 per cent. per annum, payable semiamually, and the principal and interest of said bonds shall be payable in Sold coin of the United States of America in the manner followsing t, that is to say: - one-fortieth part of the whole amount of the said principal of said indebtedness created under said proposition shall be paid each and every year at the City

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Treasury of said City of Redlands on a day and date to be hereafter fixed by the legislative branch of said municipality, together with the interest on all sums unpaid at such dates; provided, that the interest on said bonds shall be paid semi-annually so that

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ments in each year being at the date of the payment of the annual installment of the principal of such indebtedness as aforesaid, and provided further that said indebtedness shall be evidenced by the proper coupons attached to such bonds, a separate coupon being attached to each bond for each semi-annual payment of the interest to become due on such bond. That the total indebtedness authorized to be created at such election shall be represented by bonds payable in manner aforesaid, and that said bonds shall be issued in such denomination or denominations as the Board of Trustees of said city shall authorize and that said Bonds shall be known as "Municipal Improvement Bonds."

The manner of holding said special election section 5. and of voting thereat for and against incurving said indebtedness, shall be as provided in this ordinance, and that in all particulars not recited herein, such election shall be held as provided by law for holding municipal elections in such municipality, and that in particulars not recited herein and not provided by law for holding such municipal elections, the general election laws of the State of California, so far as the same may be applicable, shall apply. Said election shall be conducted by the Board of Election, consisting of two inspectors, two judges, two clerks and two ballot clerks whose dutaes and powers shall be the same as those of Board of Election and of such election officers, respectively, under the law governing municipal elections, and in particulars not covered by such law, then under the said general election laws of said State. If any of the members of said Board hereinafter named fail to attend at the opening of the polls on the morning of such election, the electors of the precinct present at that hour may supply the place of any such absent member by appointment, as provided by said general election laws. At

said Special Election the polls shall be opened at 6 o'clock on the morning of the day of such election and much be kept open until 5 o'clock in the afternoon of the same day when the polls shall be closed.

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Section 7. Any qualified voter may vote at said election in favor of said proposition to incur such bonded indebtedness by stamping a cross (X) on his ballot in the square opposite and to the right of the word 'yes' following the proposition to be voted for, and any qualified voter may vote at said election against said proposition by stamping a cross (X) in the square opposite and to the right of the word 'No' following the proposition to be voted upon.

Section 8. That the said estimated cost of the said proposed public improvement, together with all existing indebtedness of said city does not exceed 15 per cent. of the assessed value of all of the real and personal property of said city.

shall constitute the notice of said election. This ordinance shall be published once a day for at least seven days in the Redlands Daily Review, a newspaper published in said city at least six days a week, and said city clerk shall cause this ordinance to be so published and no other notice of such election need be given. This ordinance shall take effect immediately.
