An Ordinance Amending ~~the~~  
~~Ordinance No. 20~~, Section 1 of  
Ordinance No 20, as amended  
by Ordinance No. 39,

The Board of Trustees of  
The City of Rockland New  
Jersey as follows:

Section 1 of Ordinance No  
20, passed March 3, 1889, entitled  
"an Ordinance prescribing  
certain licenses, fees and pro-  
viding for the collection thereof,"  
as amended by Ordinance No.  
39, passed May 13<sup>th</sup> 1890, is

hereby amended so that said  
Section shall read as follows:  
Section 1. For the purpose of reg-  
ulation and revenue the kinds  
of businesses herein after spec-  
ified shall be licensed in the  
City of Rockland as follows:

1. Every saloon, bar, restaurant, or  
place of any description where  
spirits, wines, malt or mixed  
liquors are sold, or given away  
in quantities less than one  
quart, except drug stores  
where such liquors are sold

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only prescription of a physician  
regularly licensed under the  
laws of the State of California;  
at the rate of one hundred dol-  
lars per month.

2. Every store, restaurant, or  
other place where spirituous,  
wine, malt, or brewed lig-  
ners are sold or given away  
in quantities not less than  
one quart: at the rate of  
\$23-

provides that this shall not apply  
to places or stands where only one  
dollar is taken for the selling of  
ligners upon the premises of  
the buyer and where no liquors  
are kept on hand,

3. Every place where beer, ale, or  
porter is bottled; at the rate of  
five dollars per month.

4. Every drug store, or place where  
where drugs or medicines are sold  
and where any intoxicating liquors  
are sold or given away only upon  
prescriptions of physicians reg-  
ularly licensed under the laws  
of the State of California.

5. Every stand upon the street  
for the sale of merchandise  
of any kind; at the rate of  
two dollars per day.

6. Peddling of goods, or merchan-  
dise by any foot-peddler; at  
the rate of two dollars per day.

7. Every Cheap-John auction place  
or stand; at the rate of one hundred  
dollars per month.

8. Soliciting or canvassing by  
any book agent, artist or painter,  
and soliciting for retail orders  
for other articles of merchandise  
by those having no established  
place of business in the city; at  
the rate of two dollars per day.

9. Every pauncher's establishment;  
at the rate of ten <sup>dollars</sup> per month.

10. Every laundry; at the rate of  
two dollars per month.

11. Every Circus or menagerie, or  
both, ~~at the rate of five dollars per day~~

~~at~~ Every musical, dancing, rope,  
wire, legendarium or theatrical  
exhibition ~~other than a circus~~

is an agency for which compensation is asked or received, excepting municipal or theatrical exhibitions by residents of the city for purposes of benevolence, entertainment, or amusement; at the rate of five dollars per day.  
 12. Every dance-house or cellar; at the rate of ten dollars per day.  
 13. Every Peddling man or woman, not including fruit, vegetables, fish, and a dog; at the rate of two dollars per day.  
 14. Every person who shall enter a public place and appear before the public as a house-keeper.
