

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF REDLANDS RELATING TO TUBERCULOSIS.

The Board of Trustees of the City of Redlands do ordain

as follows:

Section 1. Every practicing physician, in the City of Redlands, shall report in writing to the Board of Health of said City, the full name, age, and address, of every person in said City, having or afflicted with tuberculosis, consulting him or attended by him, within one week thereafter.

Section 2. Every house-holder, or manager, proprietor, or keeper of any boarding house, or hotel, shall report in writing to the Board of Health of said City any person in any house or hotel under his charge having or affected with tuberculosis.

Such report shall be made within twenty-four hours after such person shall stop at such house or hotel, and he shall report all known facts concerning the illness of such person.

Section 3. Every person having knowledge of the existence of any person, having or afflicted with tuberculosis, whom he has reason to think requires or needs the attention of said Board of Health, shall at once report to said Board all known facts concerning such person so afflicted.

Section 3. Every person in charge or control of any dwelling, apartment house, or place in said City shall forthwith report to said Board, in writing, the removal of any person afflicted with tuberculosis from such dwelling, apartment house or place.

Section 4. Every physician, undertaker, house holder, proprietor, or keeper of any boarding or lodging house, shall

forthwith report in writing to said Board, the death of any person who dies from, or while afflicted with tuberculosis.

Section 6. Immediately after the removal or death of any person having or afflicted with tuberculosis, the premises, furniture, and belongings occupied and used by said person shall be thoroughly disinfected, cleansed, and renovated by such method and in such manner as may be approved by said Board of Health.

Section 7. Any information obtained by said Board of Health under the provisions of this ordinance shall be strictly private and shall not be disclosed or made public, and it shall not disclose or make public the names of any person reported as tubercular.

The names of all such persons reported as tubercular

shall be described by number and not by name in any public record made thereof.

Section 8. Said Board of Health shall prepare printed blanks, the expense of which shall be borne by the City of Redlands, for the making reports herein required, and shall furnish and supply the same upon demand, and it shall prepare and furnish in like manner suitable circulars of information for persons afflicted with tuberculosis, and those with whom they reside or live, and copies of such circulars shall be supplied to all practicing physicians in said City for free distribution to their patients, and said Board shall cause said circulars to be placed in the hands of all persons so reported to it and all persons making such reports.

Section 9. Said Board of Health shall not make visits to persons having or afflicted with tuberculosis reported to it by such physicians, nor shall it assume any sanitary surveillance of such cases (unless the person resides in a tenement or lodging

house, or unless the attending physician requests that an inspection of the premises be made.)

In no case where the person resides in a tenement house shall any action be taken if the physician requests that no visits be made by Inspectors, and is willing himself to deliver circulars of information, or to furnish such equivalent information as is required to prevent the communication of the disease to others.

Section 10. ^a If at any time, in the judgment of the Board of Health, it shall become necessary, for the public safety, to assume sanitary surveillance on account of the negligence or unwillingness of the attendant who assumes the duties of giving instruction, as provided for in the preceding sections; then said Board of Health shall assume such surveillance, and no person shall interfere with or obstruct the inspection or examination of any building or house, or the occupants thereof, by the representative of said Board of Health, when any case of tuberculosis has been reported as existing in said building or house.

Section 11. ¹⁰ Every person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine not exceeding \$100, or by imprisonment in the County Jail not exceeding twenty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 12. ¹¹ This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the 1st day of September, 1906.
