

Ordinance No. 77.

An Ordinance supplemental to Ordinance No. 26, and prescribing a license for the business of Express-men.

The Board of Trustees of the City of Oakland do ordain as follows:

Sec. 1. For the purpose of regulation and revenue the business of carrying goods, wares, or merchandise in wagons by Express-men for others shall be licensed in the City of Oakland as follows: - Every wagon used in such paid business: ~~at~~ the rate of two dollars and no per cent.

Sec. 2. The rate of license fixed by the foregoing section is hereby imposed upon and shall be collected in advance from every person, firm or corporation carrying ^{on} or conducting such paid business in the city; and no person, firm, or corporation, shall, either by himself or themselves, or by his or their agents or employees, carry on or conduct such business with out having first paid the amount of said license.

Sec. 3. The provisions of Sections 3, 6 and 7 of Ordinance No. 26

entitled "an Ordinance prescribing certain licenses and providing for the collection thereof," passed March 5th, 1889, shall so far as applicable be in force concerning the license fixed by this Ordinance.

Art. IV, Any violation of the provisions by this Ordinance is hereby declared to be a misdemeanor and shall be punishable by a fine of not more than fifty dollars, nor less than ten dollars or by imprisonment in the city Prison for not more than five days nor less than
