

An Ordinance granting a right to the Bear Valley Land and water Company to erect and maintain a telephone line,

The Board of Trustees of the City of Redlands do enact as follows:

Sec. 1. There is hereby granted to the Bear Valley Land and Water Company, a corporation having its principal place of business in said City, the right to erect and maintain a telephone line on and along certain streets and corners of said city as follows, viz: beginning at the office of the said Company on Watert Street; thence East ~~by~~ on along said water street to the curb line on the west side of orange street; thence south on and along orange street to the south side of Citrus Avenue; thence east on and along Citrus Avenue to the Eastern boundary of the city.

Sec. 2. The surface of said telephone line shall be supported by redwood poles 4 by six inches in thickness

and, ~~level of~~ feet above the ground - 4 feet when stretched across a sheet in area in which rows such wires shall be hung at an elevation of twenty four feet above the level of the ground, and the said poles shall be set not more than two hundred and ten feet apart and shall be securely and firmly planted in the ground.

Sec. 3. The right conferred by this Ordinance shall be accepted subject to the conditions above expressed and a failure to comply with such conditions shall work a forfeiture of said right.

Sec. 4. This Ordinance shall take effect from and after the date of its passage.

Passed at an adjourned regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of said City held on the 8th day of October 1890.
