

ORDINANCE No. 405.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF REDLANDS Prohibiting
the Use of Lunch Wagons or Counters upon the Public Streets of said City

The Board of Trustees of the City of Redlands do ordain as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to keep, establish or maintain, or permit to be kept, established or maintained, any lunch wagon, or lunch counter, or place where tamales, lunches, meals or drinks are sold or furnished upon any public street, avenue, alley, or public grounds in the City of Redlands, or to sell or offer for sale from any wagon, cart, or vehicle upon any such street, avenue, or public grounds tamales, lunches, meals or drinks.

Section 2. Any person violating any of the provisions of the foregoing section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punishable by a fine not exceeding Twenty-five Dollars, or by imprisonment in the County Jail not exceeding fifteen days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force in the business section of said City from and after the 15th day of April, 1907, and elsewhere from and after ~~its passage~~ *January 14, 1907.*
