ORDINANCE No. 29/-

An ordinance calling a special election to be held in the City of Redlands, on the 12th day of April A. D. 1902, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of said City the proposition of incurring an indebtedness by said City by the issuance of the bonds of City in the sum of twenty thousand dollars for the acquisition by said City of a site for a City Hall in said City, and also for the purpose of submitting to said voters at said election the proposition of incurring an indebtedness by the issuance of the bonds of said City in the sum of fifty thousand dollars, to be expended by said City in the improvement of the main streets and main highways of said City .

The Board of Trustees of the City of Redlands, do ordain as follows. Section 1. That it has been determined by the legislative branch of said City, viz: The Board of Trustees of the City of Redlands, County of san Bernardino, State of California, by a resolution duly passed by said Board of Trustees by a vote of more than two-thirds of all the members of said Board, to-wit: By a vote of all the members of said Board, at a regular meeting of said Board duly held on the 26th day of 4,20 runny 1902, and which said resolution was duly approved by the Executive of said City, viz: the President of said Board of Trustees, on the 26th day rbruary 1902, that the public necessity of said City, and of the inhabitants thereof, demandsthe acquisition by said City of the following municipal improvements, to-wit:

The acquisition by said City, of the following described land and

All that land and premises situated in the City of Redlands, County of San Bernardino, State of California, described as follows, to-wit:-

Lots numbered One (1), Two (2), Three (3), Four (4), Five (5), and Six (6), of Block "A", Orange Grove Addition to Redlands, and a strip of land adjoining on the South, beginning at a point on the East side of Fourth Street, 130 feet South of the South line of Citrus Avenue, in

branch of said City, viz: The Board of Trustees of the City of Redlands, County of San Bernardino, State of California, by a resolution duly passed by said Board of Trustees by a vote of more than two-thirds of all the members of said Board, to wit: By a vote of all the members of said Board, at a regular neeting of said Board duly held on the 5th day of March, 1902, and which resolution was duly approved by the Executive of said City, viz: the President of said Board of Trustees, on the 5th day of March, 1902, that the public necessity of said City, and of the inhabitants thereof, demands the acquisition by said City of the following municipal improvements, to wit:

The acquisition by said city of the following described land and premises as and for a site for a city Hall, to wit:

All that land and premises with the buildings now thereon, but excepting all furniture and heating apparatus now in said building, situated in the City of Redlands, County of San Bernardino, State of California, described as follows, to wit:

Lots numbered One (1), Two (2), Three (3), Four (4), Five (5), and Six (6) of Block "A", Orange Grove Addition to Redlands, and a strip of land adjoining on the South, beginning at a point on the East side of Fourth Street, 130 feet South of the South line of Citrus Avenue, in Redlands, being on the North line of the piece of land designated as an Alley, in Block "A" of the said Orange Grove Addition to the Town of Redlands, according to the map thereof on record in the office of the County Recorder in and for the County of San Bernardine, State of California, and extending East parallel with Citrus Avenue 100 feet; thence at right angles west 100 feet to the East side of Fourth Street; thence at right angles North 15 feet to the point of beginning. Also the acquisition

nia, and extending East parallel with Citrus Avenue 100 feet,; thence at right angles South 15 feet; thence at right angles West 100 feet to the East side of Fourth Street; thence at right angles North 15 feet to the point of beginning. Also the acquisition of the following Street work in said City, to-wit: the construction and completion in a kremenkamene thorough manner for travel, of the main streets and main highways of said City, including in the order m named, Cajon Street, Orange Street, Colton Avenue, Citrus Avenue, and Brookside Avenue in said City; and including as the first of said street work to be so constructed and completed, the paving with asphaltum of all that portion of State Street in said City, between the curb lines thereof, from the West curb line of Fifth Street, to the East curb line of Fourth Street, and also that portion of Orange Street in said City between the curb lines thereof, from the North curb line of Citrus Avenue to the South curb line of Water Street in anid City, at a cost of about nine thousand dollars for said paving. Section 2. It is hereby determined and declared that each of said minicipal improvements is necessary to carry out the objects, purposes, and powers of said municipality. That the estimatedcost of such acquisition of said land and premises for a City Hall site is twenty thousand dollated which sum is to great to be paid out of the ordinary annual income and revenue of said City. That the estimated cost of said acquisition of said land and premises for a site for a City Hall in said Sity, is twenty thousand dollars, which sum is to great to be paid out of the ordinary annual income and revenue of said City. That the estimated cost of such acquisition of said land and premises for site fir City Hall is twenty thousand dollars, which sum is to great to be paid out of the ordinary annual income and revenue of said City. That the estimated cost of such acquisition of all said Street work for said City is fifty thousand dollars, which sum is too great to be paid out of the ordinary annual income and revenue of said City.

If the aforesaid second proposition to incur a bonded indebtedness of fifty thousand dollars, for such acquisition of all said Street work in and for said City, shall be accepted by the vote of two thirds of all the voters voting at said special election, the bonds of said City to the amout of fifty thousand dollars principal sum, payable in gold coin of the United States, in forty years, in forty equal annual installments, with interest thereon from date, at four and one-half per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, in like gold coin, shall/issue for the payment of the cost of all said street work.

Section 4. That the said several principal sums of proposed indebtedness of twenty thousand dollars, and fifty thousand dollars, will not exceed, other together with all the indebtedness of said City for public improvements, in the aggregate, fifteen per cent of the assessed value of all the real and personal property in said City of Redlands.

Section 5. Said special election shall be, in all particulars not recited in this ordinance, held as provided by law for holding municipal elections in the said City of Redlands; and the said election shall be conducted by a Board of Election consisting of two inspectors, two judges, two clerks, and two ballot clerks, for each of the election precincts herein named. For the purpose of said special election the said City shall be and remain divided into seven election precincts to be known as 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th, precincts, as the same now exist in said City. The exterior boundaries of each of said precincts for the purposes of such special election shall be and are hereby established, created, and designated as follows, to-wit:

Said 1st Precinct shall comprise all that part of said City bounded and described as follows: Beginning at the point where the center line of Colton avenue intersects the center line of Orange street; thence east along the center line of East Colton avenue to the east line of the City; thence north along the east line of the City to the northern boundary line of said City; thence westerly along said northerly boundary line of the City to the center line of Orange street; thence south along the center line of Orange street; thence south along the Said 2nd Precinct shall comprise all that

beginning.
Said 2nd Precinct shall comprise all that part of said city bounded and described as follows: Beginning at the intersection of the center line of Orange street with the center line of State street in said city; thence westerly along the center line of West State street and the extension thereof, westerly to the point of intersection of the center line of New York street with the main railway track of the Southern Pacific Railroad Company; thence west to the west line of the City; thence north to the northerly boundary line of the City; thence easterly along said northern boundary line of the City to the center line of Orange

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Said 3rd Precinct shall comprise all that part of said City bounded and described as follows: Beginning at the point of intersection of the center line of Orange street with the center line of State street; thence westerly along the center line of West State street and the extension thereof westerly to the point of Intersection of the west line of the City; thence south to the main railway tract of the south to the main railway tract of the the part of the City thence south to the intersection of the west line of the City with the center line of west Fern avenue; thence easterly along the center line of Cajon street; thence norther, and the part of the center line of Cajon street; thence norther, and the part of the center line of Cajon and Orange and the part of the center line of cajon and orange and the part of the center line of the

Section 7. Said proposition to incur a bonded indebtedness of twenty thousand dollars for such acquisition by said City of said land and premises as and for a site for a City Hall in and for said City shall be voted for or against at said election as "City Hall Bonds."

Said proposition to incur a bonded indebtedness of fifty thousand dollars for such acquisition of all said Street work in and for said City shall be voted for pr against at said election as " Street Bonds."

Said election and the voting thereat shall be by ballot. Said ballots shall be prepared, printed, furnished, and distributed, as provided by law. Each ballot used in said election must have printed thereon, in addition to any other matter required by law, the following:

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propositions by stamping a cross on his ballot in the square at the right of the word "yes" following the proposition to be voted on; and any qualified voter may vote at said election against any of said propositions by stamping a cross in the square at the right of the word "no" following the proposition to be votedupon, . The City Clerk of said City is hereby directed to provide for each of said election precincts for use at said election, not less than seventy five ballots for every fifty qualified voters in such precinct, and a like fraction of fifty voters in such precinct.

Section 7. The polls shall be open at six o'clock in the morning of the 3 day on which the election is held, and shall be kept open until five o'clock of the afternoon of the same day, when the polls shall be closed. Section 8. This ordinance and the publication thereof shall constitute the notice of said election. This ordinance shall be published once a day for at least twelve days in the Redlands Daily Facts, a newspaper published at least six days a week in said City of Redlands, and said City Clerk shall cause this ordinance to be so published and no other notice of such election need be given, and except as in this ordingnee provided all said ballots shall be prepared and said election held as provided by law for holding such elections in said City. This ordinance shall take effect from the date of its passage and its approval by the Executive of said City.viz: the President of the Board of Trustees thereof.
