

An Ordinance determining that the public necessity demands the acquisition, construction, and completion within the City of Redlands, of certain municipal improvements, the cost of which will be too great to be paid out of the ordinary annual income and reserve of said city.

The Board of Trustees of the City of Redlands do ordain as follows:

Section 1.

It is hereby determined by the Board of Trustees of the City of Redlands, State of California, that the public necessity demands the acquisition, construction and completion within said City of Redlands of the following municipal improvements: viz: the laying out, opening, constructing and completing of an adequate system of waterways, channels, drains, ^{culverts} and conduits for safely conducting and carrying through and out of said City any and all accumulating water and waters, and the procuring of any rights of way

necessary for the foregoing purposes, the cost of which said municipal improvements will be too great to be paid out of the ordinary annual income and revenue of the said city.

Section 2. Ordinance No. 92 passed September 10th 1891, entitled as ^{is} this ordinance, is hereby repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage and the date of its approval by the President of the Board of Trustees of said City of Rockland.
