

ORDINANCE NO. 398.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF REDLANDS CALLING A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON THE 13th DAY OF December, 1906, FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF SAID CITY, THE PROPOSITION TO INCUR A BONDED INDEBTEDNESS IN THE SUM OF \$50,000.

Whereas, the legislative branch of said City of Redlands, by a resolution ^{duly} adopted by a vote of more than two-thirds of all its members and approved by the executive of said city, has declared it necessary to incur an indebtedness in excess of the money in the treasury of said city applicable to the purpose for which such indebtedness is to be incurred, to-wit, in the sum of \$50,000., for the purposes set forth in said resolution, and hereinafter mentioned.

Now, therefore, the Board of Trustees of the City of Redlands do ordain as follows:

Section 1. That the Board of Trustees of said city does hereby determine and declare that it is necessary to incur an indebtedness in the sum of \$50,000. in excess of the money in the treasury of said city applicable to the purpose for which such indebtedness is to be incurred and in excess of any money which will come into said treasury applicable to such purpose; that such indebtedness proposed to be incurred is for the following purposes, to-wit:

For electric lighting of said city to be furnished by private company for fiscal year 1907, and for care and maintenance of the streets and public parks of said city for said fiscal year (not including, however, any municipal improvement of any kind or nature whatsoever).

Section 2. A special election is hereby called to be held in said city on the 13th day of December, 1906, for the purpose of determining whether such indebtedness shall be incurred.

Section 3. If said proposition to incur said indebtedness receives the requisite number of votes to carry the same, then and in that case, bonds of said city in the amount of \$50,000., Gold Coin of the United States, shall be issued and sold for said purposes.

Bonds authorized to be issued pursuant to said election shall bear interest from their issuance until paid at the rate of five per cent (5%) per annum, payable semi-annually; and the principal and interest of said bonds shall be payable in Gold Coin of the United States of America, in the manner following, that is to say:

One-twentieth ($1/20$) part of the whole amount of said principal of said indebtedness created under said proposition shall be paid, each and every year, at the City Treasury of said City of Redlands, on a day or date to be hereafter fixed by the legislative branch of said municipality, together with all the interest on such sums unpaid at such date (provided that all of such indebtedness shall be paid within twenty years from the time of contracting the same), provided that the interest on said bonds shall be paid semi-annually so that there shall be a payment of interest on all sums then unpaid in each and every half year, one of such semi-annual payments in each year being at the date of the payment of the annual installment of the principal of such indebtedness as aforesaid, and provided further, that said interest shall be evidenced by the proper coupon attached to such bonds, a separate coupon being attached to each bond for each semi-annual payment of the interest to become due on such bond, making the amount of money necessary to be raised annually, by taxation, for an interest and sinking fund, to pay such bonds, the sum of Two Thousand Five Hundred (\$2,500.) Dollars annually for such sinking fund, and for the

interest fund, the sum of \$2500. for the first year, and \$125. less each year thereafter for said interest fund until the whole of said indebtedness be paid. That said bonds shall be issued in such denomination or denominations as the Board of Trustees of said City shall authorize, and that said bonds shall be known as "Special Municipal Bonds".

Section 4. The manner of holding said special election and of voting thereat for and against incurring said indebtedness, shall be as provided in this ordinance, and that in all particulars not recited herein, such election shall be held as provided by law for holding municipal elections in such municipality, and that in particulars not recited herein and not provided by law for holding such municipal elections, the general election laws of the State of California, so far as the same may be applicable, shall apply. Said election shall be conducted by a Board of Election, consisting of two inspectors, two judges, two clerks and two ballot clerks whose duties and powers shall be the same as those of Board of Election and of such election officers, respectively, under the law governing municipal elections, and in the particulars not covered by such laws, then under said general election laws of said State.

At said Special Election, the polls shall be opened at 6 o'clock on the morning of the day of such election and must be kept open until 5 o'clock in the afternoon of the same day when the polls shall be closed.

That for the purpose of said special election, said city shall be and the same is hereby districted and subdivided into three municipal election precincts to be known respectively, as Municipal Election Precinct Number One, Municipal Election Precinct Number Two, and Municipal Election Precinct Number Three; that the following are the boundaries of the polling places of said Municipal Election Precincts and the following named persons are hereby appointed officers of election for such precincts respectively, to-wit:-

Municipal Election Precinct Number One.

This precinct shall consist of all that portion of said city lying north of the center line of Colton Avenue.

Municipal Election Precinct Number Two.

This Precinct shall consist of all that part of said city lying south of the center line of said Colton Avenue and north of the center lines of East and West Citrus Avenues and Brookside Avenue.

This precinct shall consist of all that part of said city lying south of the center lines of East and West Citrus Avenue to the intersection of Brookside Avenue and south of the center line of Brookside Avenue.

The said polling places have been found and are hereby determined to be ~~fit~~ suitable and proper places for holding such Special Election, and said several persons have been found and are hereby determined to be qualified for said respective positions, as required by law; and they are hereby appointed such officers to conduct such election and constitute said Board of Election; and said Board of Election and said officers shall conduct and are hereby directed to conduct said Election as by law and this ordinance provided, and to canvass the votes given and cast at said Special Election and to make and deliver returns thereof to said Board of Trustees; and it is further ordered that said Board of Trustees shall meet and canvass said returns when received and declare the result of said special election at the first Friday after such election, at 2 o'clock P. M.

Section 5. The manner of voting for or against incurring such indebtedness shall be by ballot as follows, to-wit:

A sufficient number of ballots shall be and is hereby directed to be prepared and caused to be printed upon the proper kind of paper used at general elections in the State of California, by the Clerk of said City, and be furnished and provided for the use of the voters at said special election at the expense of said city, and each ballot used in said election shall have printed thereon, in addition to any other matter required by law, the following:

MUNICIPAL TICKET.

Bond Election.

To vote in favor of a proposition, stamp a Cross (X) in the square opposite and to the right of the word "yes" following the proposition to be voted on.

To vote against a proposition, stamp a Cross (X) in the square opposite and to the right of the word "No" following the proposition to voted on.

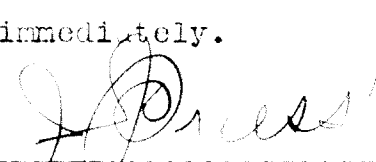

Section 6. Any qualified elector may vote at said election in favor of said proposition to incur such bonded indebtedness by stamping a cross (x) on his ballot in the square opposite and to the right of the word "yes" following the proposition to be voted for, and any qualified elector may vote at said election against said proposition by stamping a cross (x) in the square opposite and to the right of the word "no" following the proposition to be voted upon.

Section 7. That said proposed bond issue together with all existing indebtedness of said city does not exceed fifteen per cent of the assessed value of all of the real and personal property of said city.

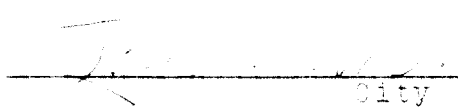
Section 8. This ordinance and the publication thereof as herein required shall constitute the notice of such election.

This ordinance shall be published once in the Redlands Daily Facts, and thereafter the City Clerk shall cause this ordinance to be published in said newspaper for at least two weeks with an appropriate heading giving notice of such special election, and no other notice of such election need be given. This ordinance shall take effect immediately.



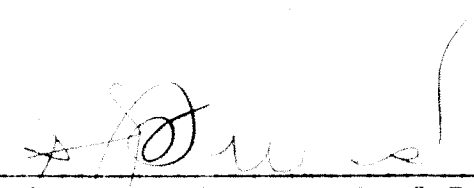
