ORDINANCE No. 475

An Ordinance of the City of Redlands requiring all vehicles to carry lights at night.

The Board of Trustees of the City of Redlands do ordain as follows.

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive any vehicle in the night time upon any street, avenue, or alley, within the City of Redlands without having a lighted lamp or lamps thereon, and so attached thereto, or exposed, that such light may be readily seen by one approaching such vehicle in either direction.

Section 2. For the purpose of this ordinance, night time is defined to be from two hours after sunset until one hour before sunrise of each day.

Section 3. Any person violating this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and punishable by a fine not exceeding \$25.00.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after April 1st, 1910.
