A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDLANDS, REQUESTING THE CREATION OF AN AIR POLLUTION CONTROL

WHEREAS, it appearing that the City Administration has investigated and considered the many problems involved in the maintenance of atmospheric purity and freedom from air contaminants and the best and most practicable steps to be taken to protect the air from pollution; and

WHEREAS, in the course of said investigation, said Administration has conferred with many of the other cities situate in the County of San Bernardino and that from said investigation said City has arrived at the conclusion that the problem of air pollution is one by reason of its many diverse causes of air pollution, the territorial extent of the problem and the need for an overall study and enforcement demands and requires the formation of an air pollution control district as specifically authorized under the recent amendments to the Health and Safety Code of the State of California.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COMMON COUNCIL:

SECTION ONE: That the honorable Board of Supervisors of the County of San Bernardino be, and they are hereby requested to take immediate steps to form an air pollution control district under the provisions of the Health and Safety Code of the State of California and that a copy of this Resolution shall be immediately forwarded to the Board of Supervisors for their consideration.
