

RESOLUTION NO. 3985

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDLANDS
APPROVING AND ADOPTING THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATIONS LIMIT
FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 1984-1985

WHEREAS, the voters of California on November 7, 1979, added Article XIII B to the State Constitution placing various limitations on the appropriations of the state and local governments; and

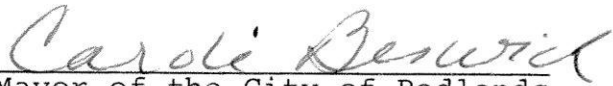
WHEREAS, Article XIII B provides that the appropriations limit for the fiscal year 1984-1985 is calculated by adjusting appropriations of fiscal year 1983-1984 for changes in the cost of living and population; and

WHEREAS, the information necessary for making this adjustment is attached in Exhibit A; and

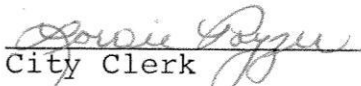
WHEREAS, the City of Redlands has complied with all provisions of Article XIII B in determining the appropriations limit for fiscal year 1984-1985;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the appropriations subject to limitation in fiscal year 1984-1985 shall be \$11,207,299.00 for the City of Redlands.

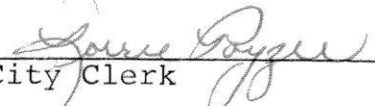

EXHIBIT A

GANN APPROPRIATION LIMITATION BILL (SB 1352)

The bill specifies that appropriations may increase by an amount equal to the change in population January to January each year and change in either the U. S. March to March cost-of-living index (C.P.I.) or per capita personal income changes, whichever is smaller.

Percentage change in City of Redlands population:	2.11%
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U. S. Consumer Price Index 4.74:	2.35
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$$1.021 \times 1.0474 = 1.069$$

1983-1984 appropriation limitation:	\$10,483,909.00
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$$\$10,483,909.00 \times 1.069 =$$

1984-1985 appropriation limitation:	11,207,299.00

PRICE AND POPULATION DATA FOR LOCAL JURISDICTIONS

Article XIIIB of the California Constitution specifies that appropriations made by governmental entities may increase annually by the change in population and the change in the U.S. Consumer Price Index or California per capita personal income, whichever is less.

The Department of Finance is charged with providing the data necessary for local jurisdictions to establish their appropriation limit. The enclosed material, therefore, should be used in setting your 1984-85 appropriation limit.

Enclosure I gives the price factor to be used in the calculation. Also shown is an example of how to determine your 1984-85 limit.

Enclosure II presents the population percent change for your city and county. These are estimated pursuant to Sections 2227 and 2228 of the Revenue and Taxation Code.

For special districts, the population change for the city or county in which the district is located is to be used. If a district is entirely within a county, the county population change should be used. If a district is entirely within the unincorporated area of a county, the county or the unincorporated area of the county population change should be used. Please note that Section 2228 of the Revenue and Taxation Code has been revised to allow districts to use the unincorporated area population change in calculating the district's population change. If you need to determine the weighted average of the population change for a special district located in more than one city or county or any combination of cities and unincorporated areas, contact the Population Research Unit for the appropriate procedures. A special district may, no later than May 31, 1984, request the Department to prepare a special district population change estimate for the district.

Enclosure III, for cities and counties only, explains the procedure to be used for certification of the January 1, 1984 population figures.

- A. Price Factor: Section 7901 of the Government Code specifies that the percentage change in the lesser of the March to March U.S. All Urban Consumer Price Index (CPI) or California 4th quarter per capita personal income is to be used as an annual percent change in determining the appropriation limit. The percent change to be used in setting the 1984-85 limit is:

U.S. Consumer Price Index: 4.74

- B. Population Percentage Change: The attached city and county population percentage changes were prepared pursuant to Sections 2227 and 2228 of the Revenue and Taxation Code and are calculated as of January 1. The change from January 1, 1983 to January 1, 1984 is used in setting the 1984-85 appropriation limit.

- C. Example using the factors for the State's appropriation limit:

Price: 4.74; Converted to a factor 1.0474

Population: 1.91; Converted to a factor 1.0191

Ratio of change: $1.0474 \times 1.0191 = 1.0674$

The change factor of 6.74 is applied to the 1983-84 appropriation limit to obtain the 1984-85 limit.
