WHEREAS, such an effort must be broad in scope to include all aspects of the environment; and

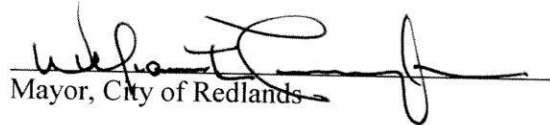
WHEREAS, success will depend on coordinated efforts of both the public and private sectors; and

WHEREAS, new programs with proven success in other locations should be considered for their applicability to the conditions in the City of Redlands.

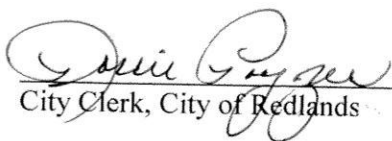

PASSED, APPROVED AND ADOPTED at a regular meeting of the Redlands City Council held on this 4th day of May, 1999.

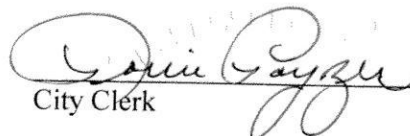
