

RESOLUTION NO. 3514

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF REDLANDS ESTABLISHING A SALARY SCHEDULE AND COMPENSATION PLAN FOR CITY EMPLOYEES AND RESCINDING RESOLUTION NOS. 3458, 3462, 3494, AND 3512

WHEREAS, the City Council is authorized and directed under Ordinance No. 1089 to prepare, install, revise and maintain a position classification plan and compensation plan covering all positions in the competitive service,

THAT the City Council of the City of Redlands hereby establishes a basic compensation plan for all officers and employees in any of the classifications of employment provided in this resolution;

THAT said Salary Schedule and Compensation Plan are hereby incorporated and attached to this resolution;

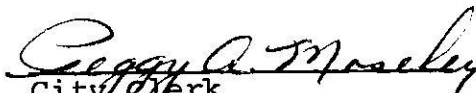
IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED:
