THAT the City Council of the City of Redlands hereby establishes a basic compensation plan for all officers and employees in any of the classifications of employment provided in this resolution;

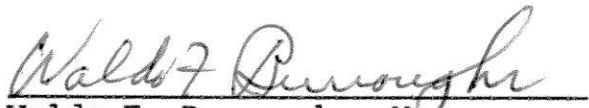
THAT said Salary Schedule and Compensation Plan are hereby incorporated and attached to this resolution;

THAT said Salary Schedule and Compensation Plan shall be effective on the 16th day of June, 1967.

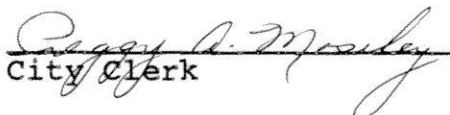
IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED:
