NOTICE OF AWARD OF CONTRACT

Pursuant to the resolution of award of the Board of Trustees of the City of Redlands, adopted on the 16th day of February, 1921, directing this notice, notice is hereby given that the said Board of Trustees, in open session, on said date, opened, examined and publicly declared all sealed proposals or bids offered for the following street work, to-wit:

The construction of a concrete curb and gutter upon the west side of Canyon Road from Garden Street south 850 feet, all according to the plans, profiles, specifications and cross sections for said work, and as shown on said plans, all on file in the office of the City Engineer of said city.

That said work is, in the opinion

of said Board, of more than local and ordinary public benefit, and the expense of said work is hereby made chargeable upon the district herein-after specified. That the exterior boundaries of said district hereby established and the exterior boundaries of the lands hereby declared to be benefited by said work and improvement, and to be assessed to pay the costs and expenses thereof, are described as follows:

The exterior boundaries of Lots 1, 2, 3, and 9 of the Country Club Park Subdivision in said city and that portion of the west half of the southwest quarter Section One, Township Two South, Range Three West S. E. M., described as follows: Beginning at the southeast corner of said lot 9, thence south 2 deg. 15 min. E. 259.3 feet, thence south 84 deg. 30 min. W. 468.9 feet; thence north 5 deg. 30 min. W. 258.4 feet; thence north 84 deg. 30 min. E. to the place of beginning.

It is hereby determined in pursuance of an Act of the Legislature of the State of California known as Improvement Act of 1911, approved April 7th, 1911, that serial bonds shall be issued to represent assessments of \$25.00 or over for the cost of said work or improvement. Said bonds shall be serial extending over a period of nine years from the second day of January next succeeding their date, and an even annual proportion of the principal sum thereof shall be payable by coupon on the second day of January of each year after that date, until the whole is paid, and the interest shall be payable semi-annually by coupon on the second days of January and July, respectively of each year at the rate of seven per cent per annum on all sums unpaid until the whole of said principal and interest are paid. Said bonds shall be issued in form as required by said Act.

And thereafter, to-wit, on the 16th day of February, 1921, awarded the contract for said work to lowest regular responsible bidder, to-wit: L. H. Jones at the prices named for said work in his proposal on file, to-wit: sixty-three cents per lineal foot for all of said work.

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Bidders must file with each proposal or bid, a check payable to said city, certified by a responsible bank, for an amount which shall not be less than ten per cent of the aggregate of the proposal, or a bond for the said amount and so payable, signed by the bidder and two sureties, who shall justify before any officer competent to administer an oath, in double the said amount, and over and above all statutory exemptions.

Bids will be opened on the 16th day of February 1921, at 2 o'clock p. m., and if a contract for said work be not then awarded, further bids will be received at any subsequent meeting of said board until a contract therefor shall be awarded.
