Notice of Award of Contract
(No. 224)

Pursuant to the resolution of award of the Board of Trustees of the City of Redlands adopted on the 10th day of February, 1904, directing this notice, notice is hereby given that the said Board of Trustees, in open session, on said date, opened, examined and publicly declared all sealed proposals or bids offered for the following street work, to-wit:

First. That West Citrus avenue from the west property line of Third street to the west property line of Fourth street be improved by having the following street work done thereon, to-wit:

(a) That the roadway of said West Citrus avenue between said points, including street intersection (excepting 27 inches in width from the curb line on each side of said avenue along the gutter way thereof) shall be paved with asphaltic cement, and broken stone base and asphalt wearing surface, in accordance with plans, specifications, profile and cross-sections therefor on file in the office of the City Engineer of said city, to all of which reference is hereby made.

(b) That one culvert be constructed along the north gutter line of said West Citrus avenue extending across the entrance into Third street. Said culvert to be 18 inches wide and 8 inches high, inside measurement, and be built of concrete, with steel plate top and with a granite curb at each end thereof, and all in accordance with plans and specification therefor on file in said engineer's office, to all of which reference is hereby made.

(c) That cobble stone gutters along each side of said avenue to be paved as aforesaid for a width of 27 inches from the curb lines thereof (excepting along said culvert) shall be constructed in accordance with plans and specifications therefor on file in said engineer's office, to all of which reference is hereby made.

Second. That West State street from the east property line of Third street (produced) to the west property line of Fourth street be improved by having the following street work done thereon, to-wit:

(a) That the roadway of said West State street between said points (excepting 27 inches in width from the curb line on each side of said street along the gutterway thereof) shall be paved with asphaltic cement and broken stone base and asphalt wearing surface, in accordance with plans, specifications, cross-sections and profile therefor on file in the office of the City Engineer, to all of which reference is hereby made.

(b) That cobble stone gutters along each side of said street to be paved as aforesaid for a width of 27 inches from the curb lines thereof, shall be constructed in accordance with plans and specifications therefor, on file in the office of said engineer, to which reference is hereby made.

And thereafter, to-wit, on the 10th day of February, 1904, awarded the contract for said work to the lowest regular responsible bidder, to-wit, the Barber Asphalt Paving Company, at the prices named for said work in its proposal on file, to-wit:

For the work specified in Subdivision a, b, and c, of paragraph first of the above described work as follows: Subdivision (a) 17 7-9 cents per square foot; subdivision (b) \$250; subdivision (c) 12 2-9 cents per square foot. For the work specified in subdivision a, and b, of paragraph second of the above described work as follows: subdivision (a) 16 2-3 cents per square foot; subdivision (b) 11 1-3 cents per square foot. And that said award has been approved by a three-fourths vote of said Board of Trustees.

A. building in said city up to two o'clock p. m. on the 10th day of February 1904, sealed proposals or bids, for the following street work, to be done according to specifications therefor, posted and on file, adopted for said work, or herein mentioned, to-wit:

First. That West Citrus avenue from the west property line of Third street to the west property line of Fourth street be improved by having the following street work done thereon, to-wit:

(a) That the roadway of said West Citrus avenue between said points, including street intersection (excepting 27 inches in width from the curb line on each side of said avenue along the gutter way thereof) shall be paved with asphaltic cement, and broken stone base and asphalt wearing surface, in accordance with plans, specifications, profile and cross-sections therefor on file in the office of the city engineer of said city, to all of which reference is hereby made.

(b) That one culvert be constructed along the north gutter line of said West Citrus avenue extending across the entrance into Third street. Bidders must file with each proposal or bid, a check payable to the order of the President of the Board of Trustees of said city, certified by a responsible bank, for an amount which shall not be less than ten per cent of the aggregate of the proposal, or a bond for the said amount and so payable, signed by the bidder and two sureties, who shall justify before any officer competent to administer an oath, in double the said amount, and over and above all statutory exemptions.

Bids will be opened on the 10th day of February 1904, at 2 o'clock p. m., and if a contract for said work be not then awarded, further bids will be received at any subsequent meeting of said board until a contract therefor shall be awarded.

No. 224.

Resolved, That the Board of Trustees of the City of Redlands deem it to be required by the public interest and convenience, and hereby orders the following street work to be done to-wit:

First. That West Citrus avenue from the west property line of Third street to the west property line of Fourth street be improved by having the following street work done thereon, to-wit:

(a) That the roadway of said West Citrus avenue between said points, including street intersection (excepting 27 inches in width from the curb line on each side of said avenue along the gutter way thereof) shall be paved with asphaltic cement, and broken stone base and asphalt wearing surface, in accordance with plans, specifications, profile and cross-sections therefor on file in the office of the city engineer of said city, to all of which reference is hereby made.

(b) That one culvert be constructed along the north gutter line of said West Citrus avenue extending across the entrance into Third street. Said culvert to be 8 inches wide and 8 inches high, inside measurement, and to be built of concrete, with steel plate top and with a granite curb at each end thereof, and all in accordance with plans and specification therefor on file in said engineer's office, to all of which reference is hereby made.

(c) That cobble stone gutters along each side of said avenue to be paved as aforesaid for a width of 27 inches from the curb lines thereof (excepting along said culvert) shall be constructed in accordance with plans and specifications therefor on file in said engineer's office, to all of which reference is hereby made.

Second. That West State street from the east property line of Third street (produced) to the west property line of Fourth street be improved by having the following street work done thereon to-wit:

(a) That the roadway of said West State street between said points (excepting 27 inches in width from the curb line on each side of said street along the gutter way thereof) shall be paved with asphaltic cement and broken stone base and asphalt wearing surface, in accordance with plans, specifications, cross-sections and profile therefor on file in the office of the city engineer, to all of which reference is hereby made.

(b) That cobble stone gutters along each side of said street to be paved as aforesaid for a width of 27 inches from the curb lines thereof, shall be constructed in accordance with plans and specifications therefor on file in the office of said engineer, to which reference is hereby made.

The City Clerk is hereby directed to publish a notice of said work, inviting sealed proposals or bids for said work, and referring to the specifications posted or on file for two days in the manner required by law, in the Redlands Daily Facts, a daily newspaper of general circulation, published and circulated in said city, hereby designated for that purpose.

Said notice shall require a cash or check or bond either, as required by law, and for an amount not less than 10 per cent of the aggregate of each proposal or bid.

He is also directed to post said notice with specifications conspicuously for five days on or near the chamber door of said Board of Trustees and he shall also cause this resolution to be published for two days, in the manner required by law, in said newspaper hereby designated for that purpose.

First, That East Citrus avenue from the east curb line of Fifth street to the west property line of Sixth street be improved by having the following street work done thereon, to-wit:

(a) That the roadway of said East Citrus avenue, between said points (excepting such portions thereof as are required by law to be kept in order and repair by any person or company having railroad tracks thereon, and also excepting 27 inches in width from the curb lines on each side of said avenue along the gutter way thereof) shall be paved with asphaltic cement and broken stone base, with asphalt wearing surface, in accordance with plans, specifications, profile and cross sections therefor on file in the office of the city engineer of said city, to all of which reference is hereby made; and

(b) That cobble stone gutters along each side of said avenue to be paved as aforesaid for a width of 27 inches from the curb lines thereof shall be constructed in accordance with plans and specifications therefor on file in said engineer's office, to all of which reference is hereby made

Second, That West Citrus avenue from the west property line of Third street to the west property line of Fourth street be improved by having the following street work done thereon, to-wit:
