NOTICE OF AWARD OF CONTRACT

No. 350

(Curbs, Gutters, Sidewalks, Clay St.)

Pursuant to the resolution of award of the Board of Trustees of the City of Redlands, adopted on the 6th day of June, 1923, directing this notice, notice is hereby given that the said Board of Trustees, in open session, on said date, opened, examined and publicly declared all sealed proposals or bids offered for the following street work, to-wit:

(a) The construction of cement sidewalks, (b) stone curbs, and (c) cement concrete gutters upon both sides of Clay Street in the City of Redlands, between the north side of Colton Avenue and the south side of Western Avenue, except where already constructed to the official line and grade of said street.

All of said work shall be done in accordance with the plans, specifications, profiles and cross-sections thereof, heretofore adopted for doing said work, and now on file in the office of the City Engineer of said City, to all of which reference is hereby made.

Said Board also determines and declares that serial bonds shall be issued to represent each assessment for \$25.00 or more, remaining unpaid for the time, and as provided by law, to represent the expenses of said work and improvement. Said serial bonds shall extend over a period of nine years from the second day of January, next succeeding their date and an even annual proportion of the principal sum thereof shall be payable by coupon on the second day of January, every year, after their date, until the whole is paid; and the interest shall be payable semi-annually by coupons, on the second days of January and July, respectively, of each year, at the rate of seven per cent per annum, on all sums unpaid, until the whole of said principal and interest are paid. Said bonds shall be issued in the form and manner and as required by the Improvement Act of 1911, so-called.

Reference is hereby made to Resolution of Intention No. 350 of said Board for further particulars, which resolution is on file in my office.

And thereafter, to-wit, on the 6th day of June, 1923, awarded the contract for said work to the lowest regular responsible bidder, to-wit: Geo. S. Abrahamson, at the prices named for said work in his proposal on file, to-wit: 14 cents per square foot for sidewalk and 62 cents per lineal foot for curb and gutter work specified above.

NOTICE INVITING SEALED PROPOSALS

NO. 350.

(Sidewalks, Curbs, Gutters, on Clay Street).

Pursuant to statute and resolution of the Board of Trustees of the City of Redlands, adopted on the 16th day of May, 1923, directing this notice, the undersigned invites and will receive at his office, in said City, up to two o'clock p. m. on the 6th day of June, 1923, sealed proposals or bids, for the following street work, to be done according to specifications therefor, posted and on file, adopted for said work, as herein mentioned, to-wit:

(a) The construction of cement sidewalks, (b) stone curbs and (c) cement concrete gutters upon both sides of Clay Street in the City of Redlands, between the north side of Colton Avenue and the south side of Western Avenue, except where already constructed to the official line and grade of said street.

All of said work shall be done in accordance with the plans, specifications, profiles and cross-sections thereof, heretofore adopted for doing said work, and now on file in the office of the City Engineer of said City, to all of which reference is hereby made.

Bidders must file with each proposal or bid, a check payable to said City, certified by a responsible bank, for an amount which shall not be less than ten per cent of the aggregate of the proposal, or a bond for the said amount so payable, signed by the bidder and two sureties, who shall justify before any officer competent to administer an oath, in double the said amount, and over and above all statutory exemptions.

Bids will be opened on the 6th day of June, 1923, at 2 o'clock, p. m., and if a contract for said work be not then awarded, further bids will be received at any subsequent meeting of said Board until a contract therefor shall be awarded.
