Resolution of Intention
No. 411

(Oriental and First St. Pavement).
RESOLVED: That the public interest and convenience require, and that it is the intention of the Board of Trustees of the City of Redlands to order the following work to be done, and improvement to be made, to-wit:

That the roadway of Oriental Avenue in said city from the east curbline of Texas Street to the east curbline of First Street and the roadway of First Street from the north curbline of Central Avenue to the south curbline of Stuart Avenue be paved with 6 inch Portland cement concrete pavement; and also the construction of concrete gutters on both sides of said Oriental Avenue and First Street along the outer edges of said pavement, excepting therefrom such portions thereof as is required by law to be kept in order or repair by any person or company having railroad tracks thereon.

All of said work mentioned shall be done and improvement made upon the grade, along the lines, between the points, of the dimensions, at the place and in the manner and as shown upon and according to the plans, profiles and detail drawings for said work according to the specifications therefor, which said plans, profiles, detail drawings and specifications have heretofore been adopted by said Board for doing said work and are now on file in the office of the city engineer of said city, to all of which reference is hereby made.

Said contemplated work and improvement is, in the opinion of said Board, of more than local or ordinary public benefit and therefore the expense of said work and improvement is hereby made chargeable upon the district described as follows, to-wit: Beginning at a point on the north line of Central Avenue 95 feet east of the east line of First Street; thence north 95 feet from and parallel with the east line of First Street to the south line of Stuart Avenue; thence west along the south line of Stuart Avenue to a point 95 feet west of the west line of First Street; thence South 95 feet from and parallel with the west line of First Street; to a point 142.5 feet north of the north line of Oriental Avenue; thence west 142.5 feet from and parallel with the north line of Oriental Avenue to the east line of Texas Street; thence south along the east line of Texas Street to a point 142.5 feet south of the south line of Oriental Avenue; thence east along a line 142.5 feet from and parallel with the south line of Oriental Avenue to a point 95 feet west of the west line of First Street; thence south 95 feet from and parallel with the west line of First Street to the north line of Central Avenue; thence east along the north line of Central Avenue to the point of beginning.

The said Board of Trustees also determines and declares that serial bonds bearing interest at the rate of seven per cent per annum shall be issued to represent each assessment of \$25.00 or more remaining unpaid for twenty days after the date of the warrant as to said work.

Said serial bonds shall extend over a period of nine years from the second day of January next succeeding the 15th day of the next November following their date. Payment on the principal of unpaid assessments and interest shall be made by property owners to the City Treasurer and the same shall be disbursed by him, all as provided in and by the Improvement Act of 1911, so-called. The principal and interest of said bonds shall be payable in the manner and as provided by said Act.

Notice is hereby given that on the 6th day of January, 1926, at 2 o'clock p. m., in the Council Chamber of said Board, any and all persons having any objections to the proposed work or improvement may appear before said Board, and show cause why said work or improvement should not be carried out in accordance with this resolution.

The City Clerk is hereby directed to publish this resolution twice in the manner required by law, in the Redlands Daily Facts, a daily newspaper published and circulated in said city, hereby designated for that purpose.

The Superintendent of Streets of said city is hereby directed to post notices of the passage of this resolution in the time, form, manner and as required by the said "Improvement Act of 1911."

All proposals or bids shall be accompanied by a check payable to the City of Redlands, certified by a responsible bank for an amount which shall not be less than ten per cent of the aggregate of the proposal, or by a bond for the said amount and so payable, signed by the bidder and two sureties, who shall justify, before any officer competent to administer an oath, in double the said amount, and over and above all statutory exemptions.

Said proposals or bids shall be delivered to the Clerk of said City, on or before two o'clock P. M., on the 3rd day of February, 1926, and if a contract for said work be not then awarded, further bids will be
