RESOLVED: By the Board of Trustees of the City of Redlands,

State of California, that the public interest and convenience require
and that the said Board of Trustees hereby order to be done, the work
of opening and extending said Street Avenue

in accordance with the resolution of intention declaring the intention
of said Board of Trustees to order said work done, and it is hereby
ordered that said work be done, in accordance with said resolution,
of intention passed by said Board on December 23, 1903, No. 223.

RESOLVED, that subject to removal by said Board at any time

for cause, C. H. Fowler, J. J. Bennett and Oscar J. Bennett

be, and they are hereby appointed Commissioners to assess the benefits
and damages and have General supervision of said work until the com-

pletion thereof, in compliance with an act of the Legislature of the
State of California, approved March 6, 1889, entitled "An Act to pro-

vide for laying out, opening, extending, widening, straightening, or
closing up, in whole or in part, any street, square, lane, alley,

court, or place, within municipalities, and to condemn and acquire
any and all land and property necessary or convenient for that pur-

pose". For their services said Commissioners shall receive the sum
of \$1150 per diem for the days on which they are ac-

tually engaged in performing said services. Said Commission shall,
every two weeks, report the progress of said work to this Board.

Before proceeding with the performance of their duties, each of said
Commissioners shall file with the Clerk of this Board of Trustees,
an affidavit and a bond to the State of California, in the sum of
