NOTICE INVITING SEALED PROPOSALS

(Washington St., Paving, Etc.)

Pursuant to Statute and to Resolution of the Board of Trustees of the City of Redlands, directing this notice, said Board hereby invites sealed proposals or bids for doing the following work in said City to-wit:

Item 1. That the roadway of Washington street in said city, between the gutters thereon, be paved with four inch macadam pavement from and connecting with the pavement on Colton Avenue to the south curb line of Delaware Avenue, including all street intersections to the property line of Washington Street produced across such intersection.

Item 2. The construction of stone curbs and cement gutters on both sides of Washington Street between Colton Avenue and Delaware Avenue where not already constructed thereon (except street intersections).

eight inch vitrified public sewer in the alleyway shown on the map of the Mountain View Tract said city, between Delaware Avenue and Pennsylvania Avenue, beginning at and connecting with the sewer now located on Washington Street, thence extending easterly in Delaware Avenue to said alleyway and thence through said alleyway to a point opposite lot 26 in said tract, together with and as a part of said sewer one manhole and 24 Y branch laterals of four inch vitrified sewer pipe.

All of said paving, curb and gutter work shall be done in accordance with the plans, specifications, profiles and cross-sections therefor, heretofore adopted for doing said work, and now on file in the office of the City Engineer of said City, to all of which reference is hereby made, and according to the grade as shown on said plans or profiles.

Said sewer, manhole and Y branch laterals to of such sizes and dimensions and to be placed where and as shown on the plans and specifications for said sewer work, and all said work and the materials therefor shall be constructed as provided by and in accordance with the specifications, plans and profiles therefor on file in said engineer's office to which reference is hereby made.

Said contemplated work and improvement, as to each of said items, in the opinion of said Board, is of more than local or ordinary public benefit, and the expense of each item of said work and improvement is hereby made chargeable upon the District hereinafter specified: that the exterior boundaries of said district hereby established, and the exterior boundaries of the lands hereby declared to be benefited by each item of said work and improvement and to be assessed to pay the cost and expenses thereof, are indicated and shown by a brown boundary line showing and indicating the exterior boundaries and extent of the territory included in such district, upon a plat or map showing the lands embraced within such district, and marked "Plans" (being the plans for such respective items of work aforesaid) and being on file in the office of said city engineer, to which respective map of each said items of work reference is hereby made.

The said Board of Trustees also determines and declares that serial bonds bearing interest at the rate of seven per cent per annum shall be issued to represent each assessment of \$25.00 or more remaining unpaid for twenty days after the date of the warrant as to each of said items.

Said serial bonds shall extend over a period of nine years from the second day of January next succeeding the 15th day of November following their date. Payments on the principal of unpaid assessments and interest shall be made by property owners to the City Treasurer and the same shall be disbursed by him, all as provided in and by the Improvement Act of 1911, so-called.

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION

(Washington St.—Paving from Colton Ave. to Delaware Ave., and Sewer from Delaware to Pennsylvania Ave. in Alley between Orange and Washington Sts.)

Resolved, That the public interest and convenience require, and that it is the intention of the Board of Trustees of the City of Redlands to order the following street work to be done, and improvement to be made, to-wit:

Item 1. That the roadway of Washington street in said city, between the gutters thereon, be paved with four inch macadam pavement from and connecting with the pavement on Colton Avenue to the south curb line of Delaware Avenue, including all street intersections to the property line of Washington Street produced across such intersection.

Item 2. The construction of stone curbs and cement gutters on both sides of Washington Street between Colton Avenue and Delaware Avenue where not already constructed thereon (except street intersections).

Item 3. The construction of an eight inch vitrified public sewer in the alleyway shown on the map of the Mountain View Tract in said city, between Delaware Avenue and Pennsylvania Avenue, beginning at and connecting with the sewer now located on Washington Street, thence extending easterly on Delaware Avenue to said alleyway and thence through said alleyway to a point opposite lot 26 in said tract, together with and as a part of said sewer one manhole and 24 Y branch laterals of four inch vitrified sewer pipe.
