RESOLUTION FINDING A PORTION OF TOYON AVENUE IS UNNECESSARY FOR PRESENT OR PROSPECTIVE PUBLIC STREET PURPOSES AND ORDERING THE VACATION OF SAID PORTION OF STREET.

The City Council of the City of Redlands ordains and resolves as follows:

SECTION ONE: The City Council of the City of Redlands having elected to proceed under provisions of Division 5. Part 1. Chapter 2 of the Streets and Highways Code of the State of California, and having held a public hearing as provided therein, hereby finds from all the evidence submitted that the portion of the street described in this resolution is unnecessary for present or prospective public street purposes and that the public interest and convenience requires the closing of said street.

SECTION TWO: This City Council hereby orders the vacation of a portion of Toyon Avenue, described as follows:

> All that part of TOYON AVENUE, a street of 30 feet right of way, in the City of Redlands, County of San Bernardino, State of California, as shown on a map of Golden West Addition, Tract 1934, as recorded in Book 28 Page 3 thereof, records of said County, lying southwesterly of the southeasterly prolongation of the southwesterly line of Ash Street, a street of 50 feet right of way, and southerly of and adjacent to Lot 10 of said Golden West Addition. Tract 1934.
